UNHCR delivers aid for thousands of Syrian civilians in an embattled suburb of Homs

A two-day lull in heavy fighting allowed UNHCR to supply desperately needed blankets, mattresses and household items to some 200 Syrian families in Homs, displaced from the Al Wa'er suburb.

Fighting has since resumed and buildings hosting hundreds of internally displaced people have been seriously damaged. In one, Alarabaeen Tower, seven members of a single family were killed during mortar attacks. At least seven other people were killed in separate incidents, and many more injured.

In late April, a caravan of 800 animals – camels, cattle, donkeys, goats, sheep and three horses – left the refugee settlement at Agando and began the three-day trek to Intikane.

It was a major logistical operation - over the course of three days, the animals were herded across Niger with food and water points along the way.
