On Approval of the Procedure for Conducting the Compulsory Medical Examinations
of Persons in Relation to Whom the Decision was Made on Execution of the Documents
Addressing the Issue of Granting the Refugee Status

Pursuant to Article 13 of the Law of Ukraine "On Refugees" (2557-14)
I ISSUE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

1. To approve the Procedure for conducting the compulsory medical examinations of persons in relation to whom the decision was made on execution of the documents addressing the issue of granting the refugee status (attached).
2. The Ministry of Health of the Autonomous Republic of Crimea, the boards of health of regional and Sevastopol town administrations, the Administrative Board of Health of Kyiv City State Administration shall approve the list of medical and preventive institutions for conducting the compulsory medical examinations of persons in relation to whom the decision was made on execution of the documents addressing the issue of granting the refugee status.
3. N.G. Goyda, Deputy Secretary of State, shall exercise control over the fulfillment of this Order.

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Procedure
for conducting the compulsory medical examinations of persons
in relation to whom the decision was made on execution
of the documents addressing the issue of granting the refugee status

1. The compulsory medical examination of persons in relation to whom the decision was made on execution of the documents addressing the issue of granting the refugee status (hereinafter referred to as the Persons) shall be conducted by assignment of the migration service bodies of the Autonomous Republic of Crimea, the regions, the cities of Kyiv and Sevastopol at medical and preventive institutions designated by the

Ministry of Health of the Autonomous Republic of Crimea, boards of health, and Sevastopol City State Administration, the Administrative Board of Health of Kyiv City State Administration.

2. A medical and preventive institution shall conduct the compulsory medical examination of a person if his/her identity card is available, and in relation to whom the decision was made on execution of the documents addressing the issue of granting the refugee status.
3. The compulsory medical examination of a person shall be conducted by the following medical specialists:
therapist;
pediatrician (for children);
obstetrician-gynecologist (for women).

Should need arise, the medical specialists shall have the right to invite physicians of other specialties.

The list of laboratory and functional examinations shall include the following: total blood test and urine analysis, blood test for sugar, test for syphilis, fluorography – for persons over 14 years old, as well as individual additional examinations that may be prescribed by physicians for establishing the diagnosis.

A person shall be also provided with the printed information in five international languages about the possibility of anonymous examination for HIV-infection.

Examination by specialists and laboratory, functional examinations shall be conducted taking into account the religious and national customs (for example, to ensure that obstetrician-gynecologist and specialist in skin and venereal diseases would be women; a medical specialist should explain to a person any established methods for patients' examination and taking of biological materials for laboratory examinations).

4. Medical examination findings, medical reports pertaining to the health condition of the examined person shall be recorded into the outpatient's medical chart (registration form No. 025/o).

5. The compulsory medical examination shall not be conducted:
if the examined person has an acute or infectious disease;
if the examined person has an alcohol intoxication of any origin.

6. If the examined person has an acute or infectious disease, he/she shall be provided with the inpatient or outpatient medical aid at medical and preventive institutions specified in paragraph 1 hereof.
