Life for Iraqi refugees increasingly desperate More than 4.5 million Iraqis have been uprooted by the crisis in their country. More than 2.5 million of them are displaced within Iraq, while over 2 million

have found refuge abroad, including 1.4 million in Syria and some half-a-


million in Jordan. Life is getting increasingly desperate for these refugees as

they run out of resources and, in some cases, overstay their visas.

Nansen Refugee Award - Deminers clear the way home in Lebanon The 2008 Nansen Refugee Award recognizes the heroic work of Lebanese and international deminers in clearing southern Lebanon of tens of thousands of cluster munitions and allowing uprooted civilians to return home.
