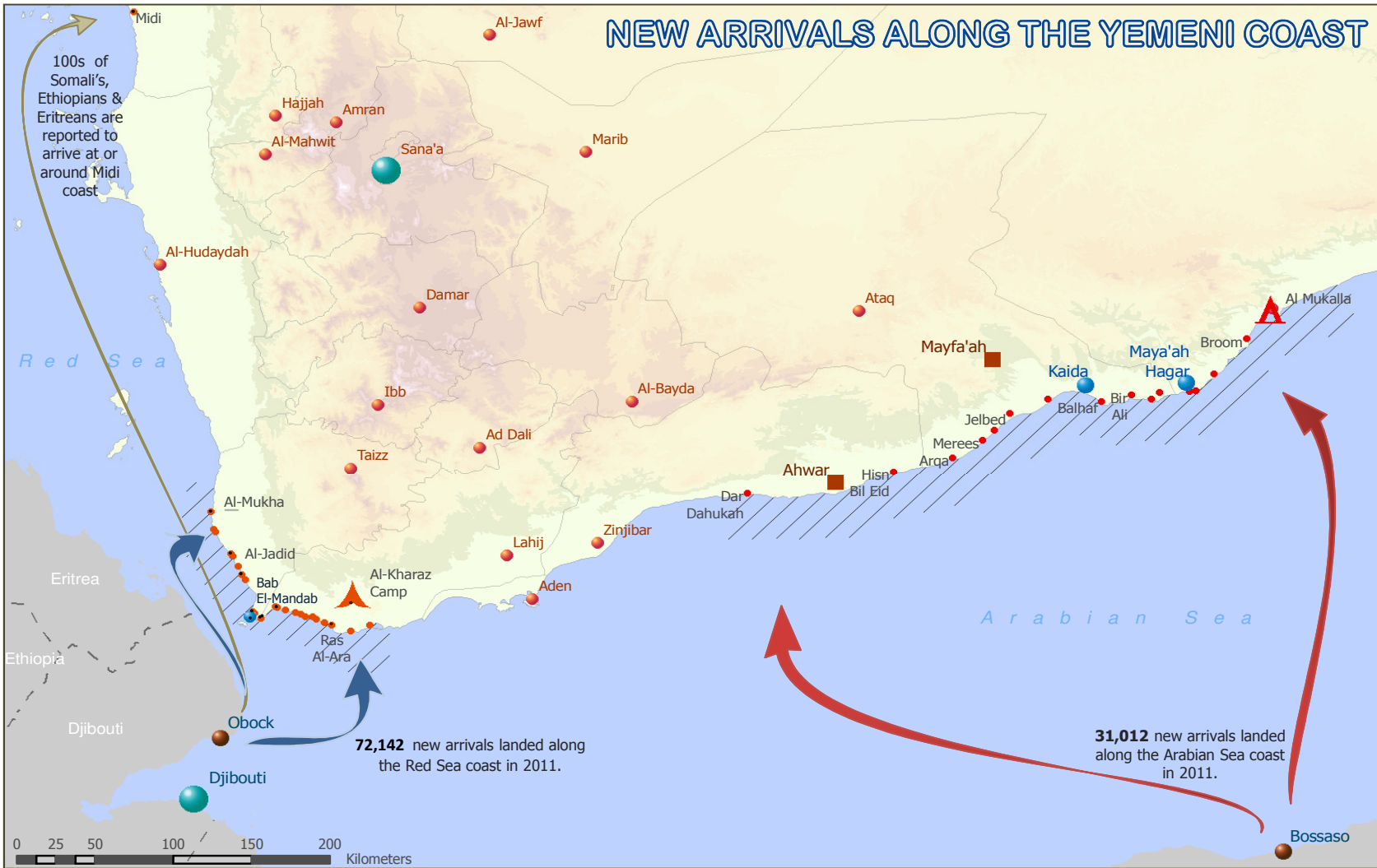
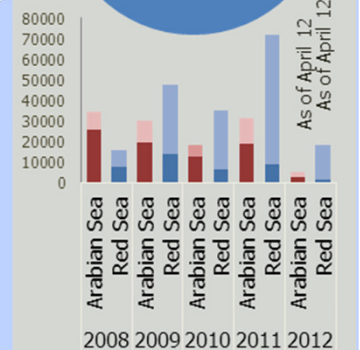


NEW ARRIVALS ALONG THE YEMENI COAST



1 Main departure/arrival points from the Horn of Africa:

- a. From **Bosasso (Somalia)** to the Gulf of Aden from **Zinjibar** to **Mukalla** eastwards.
- b. From **Obock (Djibouti)** to the Red Sea/Gulf of Aden coast (from **Bab El-Mandab** to south of **Hudaida** (northwards) and to **Ras Al-Ara** (eastwards))

2 Patrolling/ transportation to transit centers:

- a. UNHCR and partners (YRC & DRC) patrol parts of the Red Sea/Gulf of Aden coast, and transport NAs to Bab El-Mandab transit Centre. Patrolling coverage only goes as far north as **Al-Mukha**. However, numerous NAs are reported to land north of the current area of coverage, and are vulnerable to smugglers & traffickers and unable to receive proper information on the procedures to seek asylum for those in need for protection.
- b. Along the Gulf of Aden, UNHCR and SHS patrol and transport NAs to transit and reception centres.

3 Transit and Reception Centres:

- Patrolling teams transport NAs from the coast to the nearest transit centres to:
 1. Provide First Aid and Food
 2. Gather initial information about asylum seekers
 3. Identify vulnerable/ protection cases immediately
- Somali NAs and vulnerable non-Somali NAs are transported to the closest UNHCR reception centres (**Kharaz camp RC** from **Bab El-Mandab TC** on the Red Sea; and to **Mayfa'a Hadjar TC** and **Kaida TC** along the Gulf of Aden.

4 Kharaz Camp:

- The camp hosts 17,000 Somali Refugee and nearly 900 Ethiopian Refugees.
- Somali and vulnerable non-Somali NAs are hosted in the reception area in Kharaz camp run by SHS. DRC conducts registration.
- The Government of Yemen recognizes Somalis as prima facie refugees and conducts registration and issues refugee ID cards. UNHCR conduct Refugee Status Determination for non-Somalis and provides refugee identification documents.
