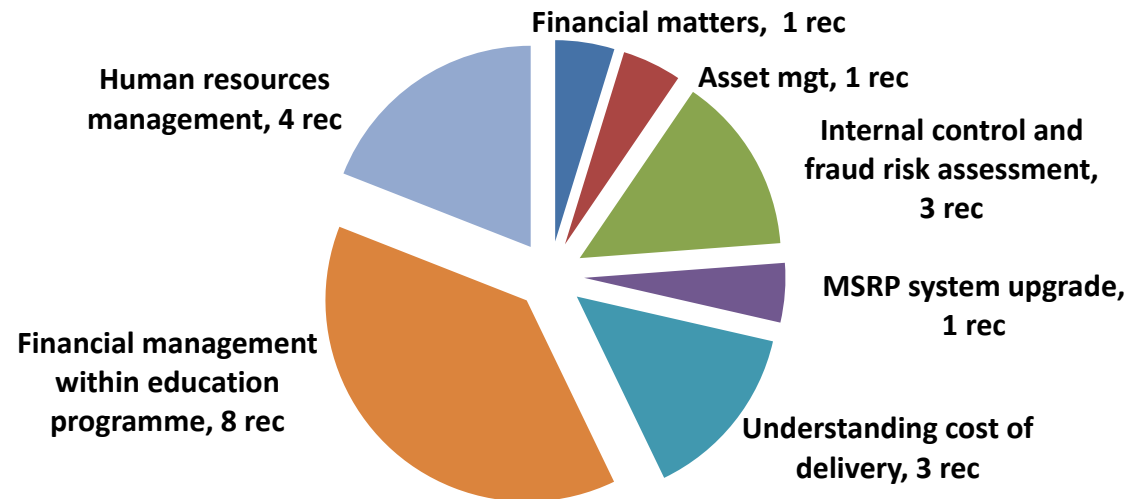


External Audit

- The UN Board of Auditors carries out an annual audit of UNHCR's financial statements
- UNHCR's current external auditor is the National Audit Office of UK until 30 June 2016; as of 1 July 2016 the Federal Court of Audit (FCA) of Germany will be the new external auditor
- The Board reviews implementation of the recommendations

Findings and recommendations in 2014

Recommendations issued per area

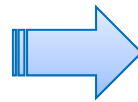


Key issues and measures taken

A. Financial Matters

Board recommendation:

- Work with donors to improve profiling of resources to facilitate better forecasting



UNHCR Actions:

- ✓ Forecasting has been increasingly accurate in the last few years
- ✓ Pursuing multi-year contributions
- ✓ Sought to improve the systems for recording and reporting; and institute control mechanisms to enhance accuracy of data
- ✓ Closer collaboration with donors

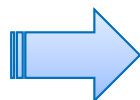
UNHCR considers this recommendation as closed

Key issues and measures taken

B. Asset Management

Board recommendation:

- Collect metrics and demonstrate realization of planned benefits in the GFM



UNHCR Actions:

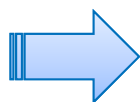
- ✓ An independent assessment has been conducted confirming the project is on track and benefits being realized
- ✓ INSEAD was engaged to continue monitoring and analysis of the results
- ✓ Findings of this study forms the basis for the development of specific financial reporting criteria on the use of global fleet

Key issues and measures taken

C. Internal control and fraud risk assessment

Board recommendation:

- Adopt data analytics to review compliance to key controls and build them into a systematic process
- Enhance internal risk-based verification process
- Establish clear time frame for fraud risk assessments and mitigation plans



UNHCR Actions:

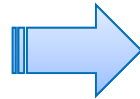
- ✓ Implementing GRC modules that enables analytics to review compliance with key controls and identify control exceptions or unusual transactions
- ✓ Policies to improve monitoring of reports by partners, and risk-based verification of projects are rolled out (full implementation expected end of 2016)
- ✓ Most relevant fraud risks were identified and assessed against the internal control framework to identify mitigation measures. Basic e-learning will be rolled out in 2016 to raise fraud and corruption awareness

Key issues and measures taken

D. MSRP Upgrade

Board recommendation:

- MSRP upgrade project - draw up clear statement of benefits and enhance project risk process



UNHCR Actions:

- ✓ UNHCR to develop a statement of benefits plan in respect of the 18 key priorities identified
- ✓ MSRP upgrade project risks have been mapped out, with mitigation measures put in place

Key issues and measures taken

E. Understanding cost of delivery

Board recommendation:

- Scrutinize and disclose implementing partners administrative costs
- Further develop the annual programme review process in terms of challenging efficiency in programme budgets and to identify the key efficiency outcomes



UNHCR Actions:

- ✓ UNHCR will continue to strengthen the process of reviewing partner expenses
- ✓ Introduced an additional note to the financial statements of 2015, disclosing the total contributions to project headquarters support costs of international partners
- ✓ UNHCR reviews, assesses, documents and approves systematically each year what it considers to be the optimal use of funds in each area

Key issues and measures taken

F. Financial management in education programme

Board recommendation:

- Strengthen the process of scrutiny to further challenge the cost-effectiveness of proposed interventions & develop performance metrics to enable comparison
- Analyse better the linkages between costs and outcomes
- Standardize performance indicators and their selection



UNHCR Actions:

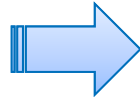
- ✓ Established cross divisional working group to review existing processes and provide guidance for the analysis of cost-effectiveness and selection of indicators
- ✓ Developing a data management system that facilitates data collection using standardized education indicators across various locations with different refugee settings and education systems
- ✓ Invested in capacity-building for staff and partners on education data management by developing training materials and conducting regional workshops

Key issues and measures taken

G. Human Resources

Board recommendation:

- Senior management to review workforce data
- Plan future staffing requirements to better align workforce with demand
- Streamline process on staff deployment/redeployment



UNHCR Actions:

- ✓ DHRM now submits workforce data to the Senior Management Committee (SMC) for periodic review
- ✓ UNHCR's People Strategy has been released establishing a system to analyse trends that affect demand for the number, location and skills of staff
- ✓ UNHCR remains focused on developing better mechanisms to review applications and analyse all options to make the deployment process more responsive and timely

Conclusion

- Addressing the Board's recommendations is a management priority and there have been notable progress
- Board's findings and recommendations have allowed UNHCR to focus its resources on the most relevant risk areas
- UNHCR will continue to take action to address them and reiterates its commitment to improving procedures, systems and controls in order to mitigate the identified risks
