## The 2008 Bid Procedure

The 2008 Bid Procedure marked the first time that the new two phase system which had been approved at the December 1999 IOC Session was used.

The first phase of the procedure, referred to as the "Candidature Acceptance Procedure" or "Applicant City Phase" was conducted under the authority of the IOC Executive Board. During this entire phase all cities were considered as "Applicant Cities".

Following the Candidature Acceptance Procedure, those cities accepted as "Candidate Cities" advanced through to a second phase which is referred to as the "Candidature Procedure" or the "Candidate City Phase".

## **TIMELINE & REQUIRED APPLICANT STEPS**

1 February 2000	Deadline for NOCs to submit the name of an Applicant City.	
24 February 2000	A preliminary IOC information meeting was held for the Applicant Cities.	
25 February - 20 June 2000	During this period the Applicant Cities were required to prepare their replies to the "Questionnaire for Cities Applying to Become Candidate Cities to Host the Games of the XXIX Olympiad in 2008".	
20 June 2000	Deadline for the Applicant Cities' submission of their replies to the "Questionnaire".	
21 June 2002 - 28 August 2000	The Applicant Cities' replies were examined by an IOC Candidature Acceptance Working Group.	
28 August 2000	<ul> <li>Presentation of the <u>IOC Candidature Acceptance</u>         Working Group's Report to the IOC Executive Board.</li> <li>The Applicant City Phase ends with the Executive Board acceptance of those Cities which will go forward into the Candidate City Phase.</li> </ul>

#### **TIMELINE & REQUIRED CANDIDATURE STEPS**

28 August 2000	The IOC Executive Board's decision to accept Osaka, Paris, Toronto, Beijing and Istanbul as Candidate Cities marked the transition to the second phase of the 2008 bid procedure.	
6 September 2000	Deadline for the signing of the Candidature Procedure document by each Candidate City and its NOC.	
25 September 2000	An IOC information meeting is held for the Candidate Cities.	
September 2000 - 7 January 2001	During this period the Candidate Cities were required to prepare their Candidature File.	
December 2000	A 10 minute presentation to the IOC Executive Board is made by a small delegation from each Candidate City.	
17 January 2001	Deadline for Candidate Cities to submit their Candidature File and a USD 150,000 deposit to the IOC.	
Mid February - mid April 2001	During this period the 2008 Evaluation Commission made a four-day visit to each of the Candidate Cities.	
Mid May 2001	The "Report of the IOC Evaluation Commission for the Games of the XXIX Olympiad in 2008" was released.	
13 July 2001	The Candidature Phase draws to a close at the IOC Session with the final presentations of the Candidate Cities and the election of the 2008 Olympic Host City.	

## The 112<sup>th</sup> IOC Session, Moscow, 2001

## THE CANDIDATE CITY PRESENTATIONS

The final step for each 2008 Candidate City was to make a presentation to the 112<sup>th</sup> IOC Session on 13 July 2001 in Moscow. Each presentation was a maximum of 45 minutes with each presenting delegation comprising six official delegates, four advisors and the IOC Members in the country. The presentation was followed by questions from the floor.

#### THE REPORT OF THE 2008 EVALUATION COMMISSION

Following the presentations by the Candidate Cities, and before the vote took place, the 2008 Evaluation Commission presented its Report to the Session.

## THE VOTE

As stated above, the vote to select the Host City for the Games of the XXIX Olympiad was carried out on 13 July 2001 by secret ballot. As per the voting regulations, only those IOC members who were not nationals of countries for which there was a candidate city in a round were permitted to vote. The result of the vote was as follows, with Beijing elected as the Host City in the second round.
