Introduction

Rhythmic gymnastics made its Olympic debut at the Games of the XXIII Olympiad in <u>Los Angeles in 1984</u>, and has been on the programme ever since. One event (individual) was included until <u>1992</u>. At the Games of the XXVI Olympiad in <u>Atlanta in 1996</u>, a second event (team) was added to the programme.

Key stages

Entry

• **1980**: At the 83rd IOC Session held in Moscow in July and August, the inclusion on the Olympic programme of a women's rhythmic gymnastics event was accepted.

1984-1992: 1 event (women's)1996-2016: 2 events (women's)

• 1996: 9 teams

2000-2004: 10 teams2008-2016: 12 teams
