













# SUDAN: Arrivals from South Sudan | 1 – 15 September 2016

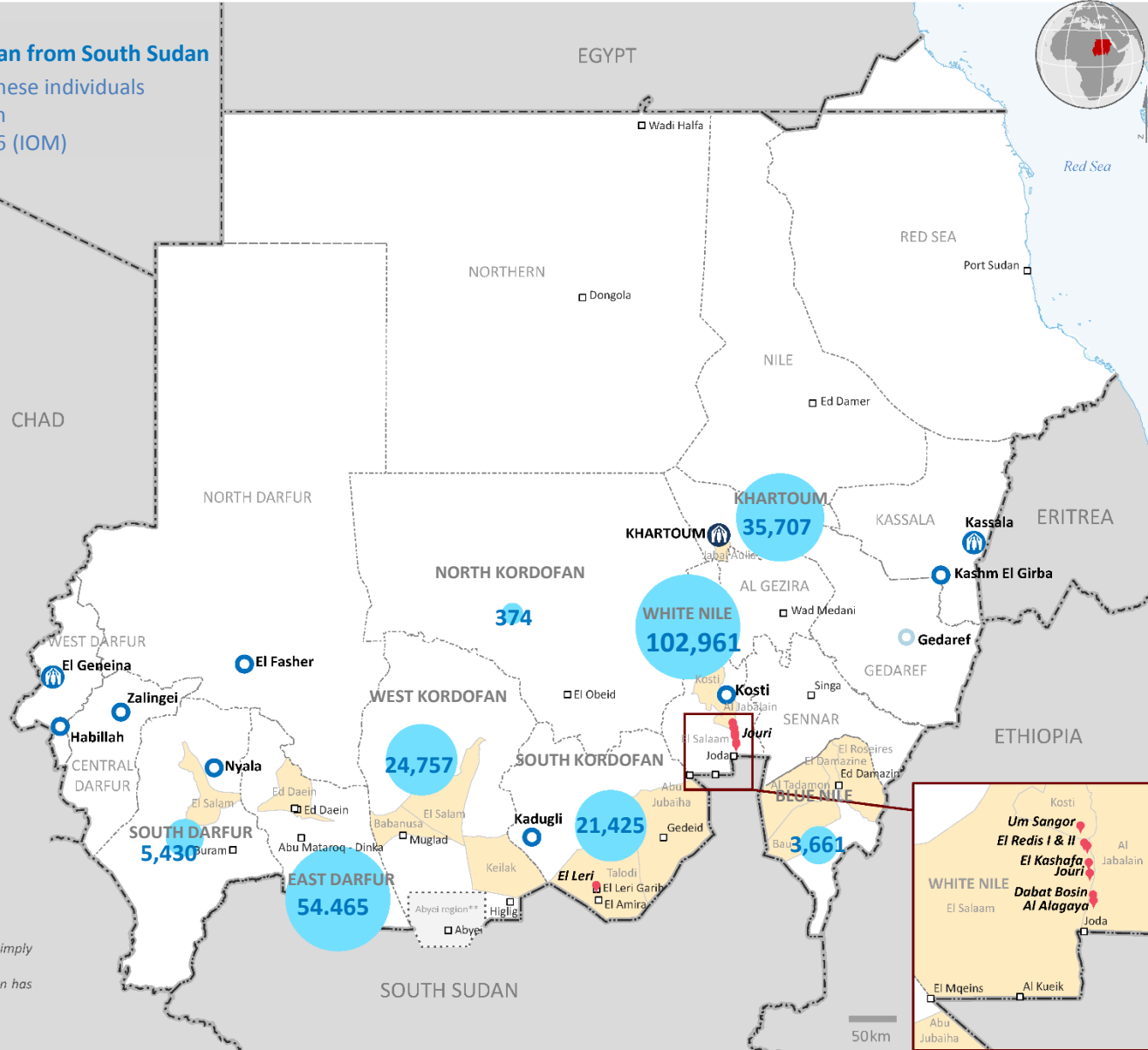
Over **248,780** persons have arrived in Sudan from South Sudan
