



The 2020 Bid Procedure

The 2020 Bid Procedure followed the same two phase system that had first been introduced for 2008.

For the first time, NOCs were asked to submit guarantees with respect to WADA compliance and the jurisdiction of CAS, together with the submission of the name of the Applicant City.

TIMELINE & REQUIRED APPLICANT STEPS

1 September 2011	Deadline for NOCs to submit the name of an Applicant City.		
1 September 2011 - 15 February 2012	During this period the Applicant Cities were required to prepare their replies to the "IOC Questionnaire".		
3 and 4 November 2011	 An IOC information seminar was held for the 2020 Applicant Cities. 		
15 February 2012	Deadline for the Applicant Cities' submission to the IOC of their application files with letters of guarantee and replies to the "Questionnaire".		
February - April 2012	The Applicant Cities' replies were examined by the IOC 2020 Working Group and experts.		
23 May 2012	Presentation of the 2020 Working Group's <u>"Report"</u> to the IOC Executive Board.		
	The Applicant City Phase ends with the Executive Board's acceptance of those Cities which will go forward into the Candidate City Phase.

2020 Olympic Games Bid Procedure 'Quick Reference'

TIMELINE & REQUIRED CANDIDATURE STEPS

23 May 2012	The IOC Executive Board's decision to accept Istanbul, Tokyo and Madrid as Candidate Cities marked the transition to the second phase of the 2020 Bid Procedure.		
23 May 2012 - 7 January 2013	During this period the Candidate Cities were required to prepare their answers and Candidature File.		
27 July – 12 August 2012: Games of the XXX Olympiad	Participation of the Candidate Cities in the Observer Programme organised by the IOC and the London Organizing Committee (LOCOG).		
14 - 21 November 2012	Candidate City representatives attend the 2012 Olympic Games Debriefing held in Rio de Janeiro.		
7 January 2013	Deadline for the Candidate Cities to submit the guarantees and their Candidature File to the IOC.		
March 2013	 During this period the 2020 Evaluation Commission made a four-day visit to each of the Candidate Cities. 		
25 June 2013	The "Report of the 2020 Evaluation Commission: Games of the XXXII Olympiad" was released.		
3 and 4 July 2013	 The Candidate Cities presented the technical aspects of their bids at the two-day 2020 Briefing for IOC Members. 		
7 September 2013	The Candidature Phase drew to a close at the 125 th IOC Session in Buenos Aires with the final presentations of the Candidate Cities and the election of Tokyo as the 2020 Olympic Host City.

THE CANDIDATE CITY PRESENTATIONS

The final step for each 2020 Candidate City was to make a presentation to the 125th IOC Session on 7 September 2013 in Buenos Aires. Each presentation was a maximum of 45 minutes. The presentation was followed by questions from the floor.

THE REPORT OF THE 2020 EVALUATION COMMISSION

Following the presentations by the Candidate Cities, and before the vote took place, the 2020 Evaluation Commission presented its oral report to the Session.

THE VOTE

As stated above, the vote to select the Host City for the Games of the XXXII Olympiad was carried out on 7 September 2013 by secret ballot. As per the voting regulations, only those IOC members who were not nationals of countries for which there was a candidate city in a

round were permitted to vote. The result of the vote was as follows, with Tokyo elected as the Host City in the second round.
