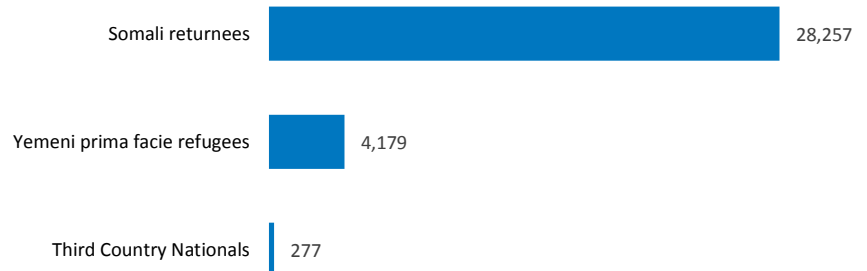

HIGHLIGHTS

- During the reporting period, there has been three boat arrivals from Yemen to Somalia, in Puntland (14 Yemeni, 74 Somali and 1 Ethiopian) carrying a total of 89 individuals.
- Of the new arrivals, 60 went to the Bossaso reception center and were registered by UNHCR in direct collaboration with local authorities and partners.

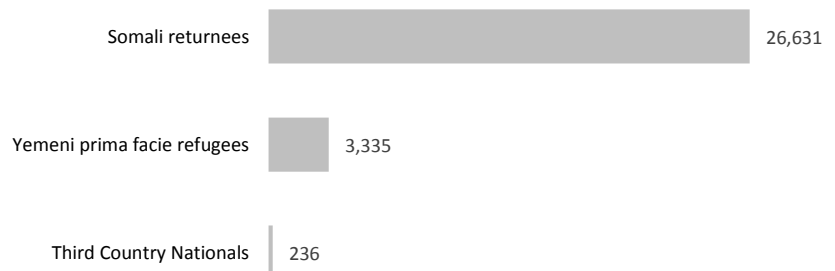
Population of concern

2015 Population of concern

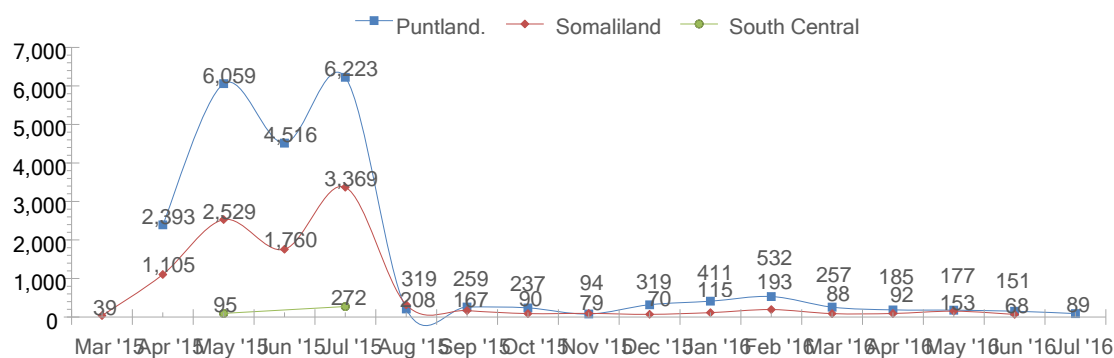
A total of **30,202** people of concern in 2015

UPDATE ON ACHIEVEMENTS

Operational Context

PUNTLAND

- New arrivals from Yemen have remained low in comparison to last year in June. UNHCR has received 2,148 similarly 89 individuals during reporting period. Despite the low number of arrivals the situation remains unpredictable in Yemen and possible new arrivals might be expected.

Achievements

Protection

PUNTLAND

- During reporting period three boats arrived via port of Bossaso carrying 74 individuals with the above nationality breakdown.
- In Bossaso the new arrivals were assisted with refreshments provided by DRC, while transport from the port to the Reception Centre was supported by IOM. Biometric registration for all arrivals and refugee certificates co-signed by UNHCR and Ministry of Interior were also provided to 14 refugees.
- While food provision starts upon arrival at the Reception Centre upon each arrival, three daily meals over a period of five days are provided by WFP.
- Onward transportation assistance (OTA) for those who want to return to their areas of origin was provided by IOM, meanwhile emergency cash and NFIs assistance to new arrival refugees upon registration is currently being processed by UNHCR.

Health

PUNTLAND

- Yemeni refugees continue to receive medical assistance through UNHCR Implementing partner Gruppo per le Relazioni Transculturali (GRT) during biometric registration, in case of medical emergency and after registration for all other cases. In total 4HH (13 individuals) received medical assistance during the reporting period.

Food Security and Nutrition

PUNTLAND

- The Puntland Students Association, contracted by WFP, provided cooked meals to all new arrivals at the Reception Centre in Bossaso for a period of five days, consisting of three cooked meals daily.

Water and Sanitation

PUNTLAND

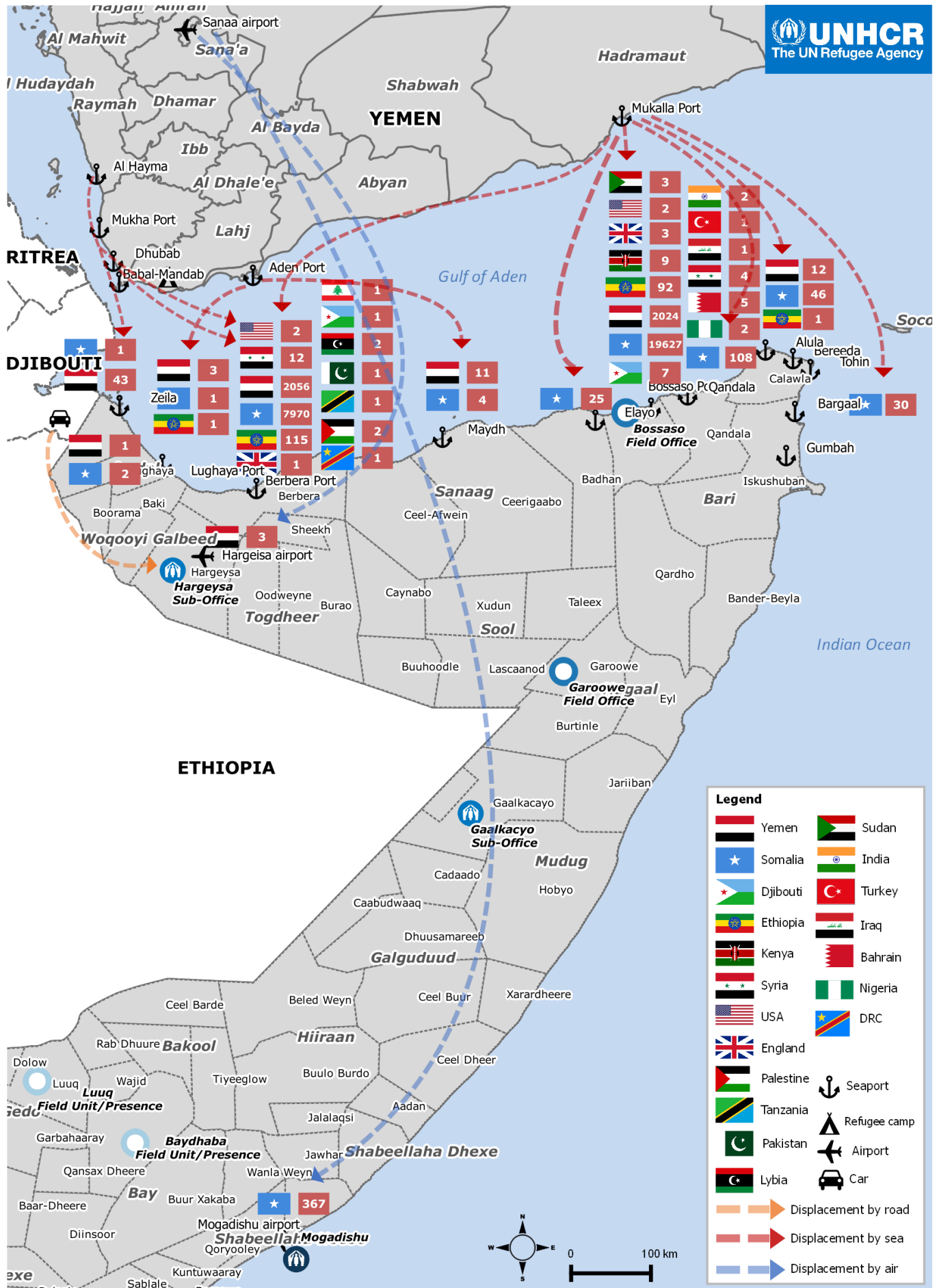
- Drinking water and sanitation both are provided at the Reception Centre in Bossaso by UNHCR through the Ministry of the Interior. Water consumption and provision depends on the number of arrivals, so far 2 trucks per week have been recorded during summer time.



Logistics

PUNTLAND

- During the reporting period, 19 Somali returnees from South and Central Somalia were provided with Onward Transport Assistance (OTA) to enable them to reach their places of origin in a safety and dignified manner.

 - Kismayo: 4
 - Jawhar: 2
