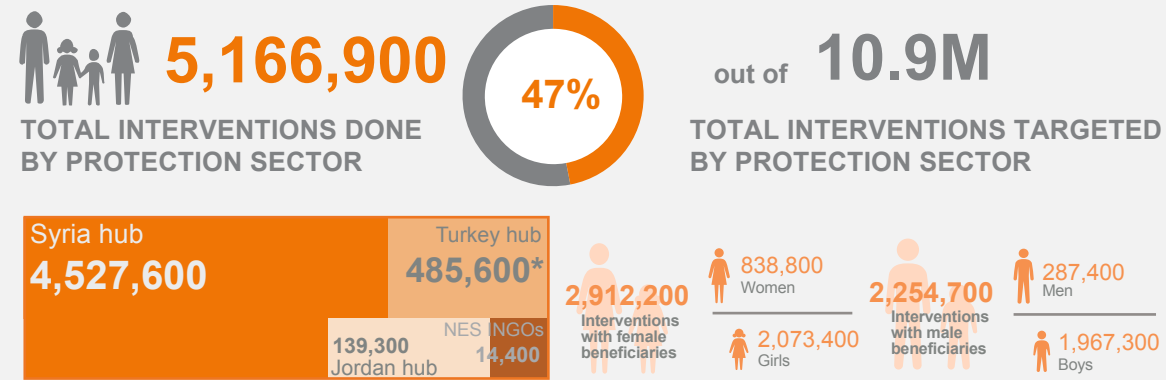


Syrian Arab Republic: Whole of Syria Protection Sector response snapshot for 2016 (as of 30 September)

From January to September 2016, the Protection sector has conducted 5.2M interventions in 216 out of 272 sub-districts in Syria through one or more of its prevention/risk mitigation, response or capacity building activities. Prevention/risk mitigation activities conducted by sector members include awareness raising, risk education, community based psychosocial support, protection monitoring etc and response services like individual and group psychosocial support, case management, referrals to other services, material/cash assistance etc. Many of the interventions are done through community centres, schools, child friendly/ women safe spaces or using outreach volunteers.

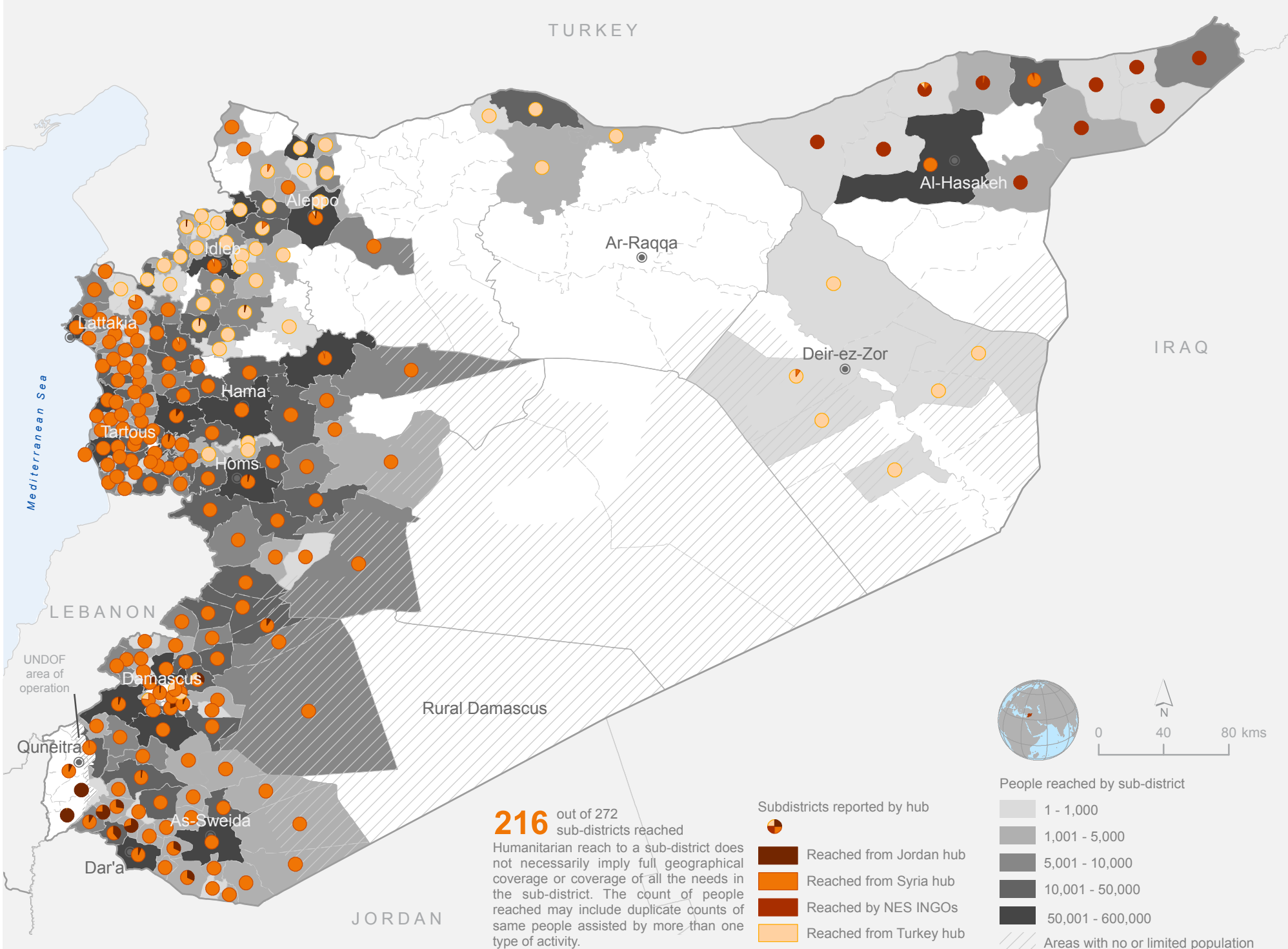
