The Supreme Court found that the applicant was not a "foreigner". As such it was not necessary for the applicant to hold a Foreigner Registration Certificate with the Court concluding that: "[i]n other words, she must be deemed to be a citizen within the meaning of s. 4(2) of the Union Citizenship Act".
