MAIN ACTIVITIES

Protection

- UNHCR through its partner CEMIRDE is providing free legal assistance to refugees and asylum-seekers in Maputo province improving access to protection and national services to promote local integration. CEMIRDE also facilitates the access to naturalization procedures in Maputo, Nampula and Maratane for those refugees who meet the criteria.
- Over 15,800 refugees and asylum- seekers were verified in Maputo, Nampula City and Maratane Camp. Verification is ongoing in other provinces and should be finalized by December, subject to security development.

SGBV and Child Protection

As part of the integrated response to SGBV, a study of SGBV and its underlying causes in the camp is being carried out
jointly with Department of Women and Social Affairs. UNHCR's Global Child Protection Strategy is in the process of
being rolled out.

Education

2,800 students are enrolled in the primary school in Maratane camp, of whom 61 per cent are refugees and asylum-seekers. In 2016, UNHCR continues to provide full support to primary education at the camp. The Government is piloting the implementation of secondary school in the camp using existing primary school facilities, providing classes for 250 students. This welcoming development also created concerns regarding overcrowding and heavy burden on existing facilities.

Health

- The health centre in Maratane camp provides health care and basic medicines to people of concern and the local population equally, covering around 20,000 people. UNHCR purchases medicines for treatment of the chronically-ill and emergency cases and supports medical referrals to secondary and tertiary health care.
- Refugees and asylum-seekers have free access to national HIV/AIDS programmes and antiretroviral treatment (ART) services. Voluntary counseling and testing is available at Nampula Central Hospital and at the Anchilo District Hospital. The Ministry of Health in Nampula provides training and workshops for motivators on HIV/AIDS. Prevention of mother-to-child transmission services are fully functional and male and female condoms are distributed in the camp.

Food Security and Nutrition

- WFP and UNHCR ensure monthly food assistance to on average 9,000 refugees and asylum-seekers in Maratane camp. In 2015, both agencies jointly assessed the feasibility of introducing cash-based assistance in view of enhancing self-reliance and improving targeted food assistance system. INAR is responsible for food and core relief items distribution and warehouse management.
- People with specific needs are assisted by UNHCR with supplementary and complementary feeding provided through
 its partner the Department of Social Affairs. With the support of the Scalabrini Brothers, complementary feeding is also
 provided in the kindergarten for 170 children to reduce the risk of chronic malnutrition for children under 5 years old.

Community Empowerment and Self-Reliance

• UNHCR is enhancing self-reliance as a way to facilitate local integration. UNHCR, jointly with WFP and UN Habitat, has designed a multi-year plan, in line with the District Development Strategy, to promote agricultural and non-agricultural livelihood opportunities, enhancing the self-reliance and integration of refugees. Livelihoods and site planning components will require additional financial resources.
