


# Indonesia: Ethnic-related violence and displacement in the Kalimantan provinces (1997-2010)

## IDP numbers

It is estimated that up to 200,000 people, comprising mostly Madurese, were displaced from West and Central Kalimantan between 1997 and 2001. In West Kalimantan, most IDPs have resettled or integrated locally as they have not been allowed to return to their home areas in Sambas. In Central Kalimantan, return has been possible since 2004, although under stringent conditions. Most people displaced in Tarakan in September 2010 are believed to have been able to return home in the following days or weeks.
