

# SYRIAN REFUGEES LIVING OUTSIDE CAMPS IN JORDAN



Launched in 2012 as part of UNHCR's cash assessment program, the Home Visit project aims to evaluate the effectiveness of the assistance given to Syrian refugees living outside the UNHCR camps. That remarkable endeavour will provide a detailed picture of the needs, vulnerabilities and capacities of the Syrian refugees living in urban and rural settings. Between March 2012 and October 2013, 61823 home visits were conducted by a team of 250 Jordanian enumerators trained by International Relief and Development (IRD) and UNHCR. The data collected is of outstanding value and will help the international humanitarian community and the Government of Jordan to better adapt their policies.

Featured documents are important report or appeals that need to be highlighted on the page.

These documents are marked as 'Featured' in the backend and appear in a different location on the page than the other documents.


If a document is marked as 'Featured', it will only appear in this module and will be excluded from the 'Latest documents' stream.


#### Backlog


Note on funding figures

The funding figures refer to 2013.


Figures for 2014 will be displayed shortly.




# **Breakdown by Country (bubbles)**





### **Key response figures**




This module displays 'Key Response' figures, which highlight specific figures relevant in an operation.


Key response figures are different from indicators as the principle is not to allow for comparison with predefined standard and baseline. Key response figures should rather give a snapshot of the amplitude of the operation.

The Key response figures would be stored per date (only the last figure would be displayed in the module). Each key figure should be attached to a specific icon, a definition and a corresponding dashboard would also be linked.

# **Repatriation graph**




#### **New Arrival influx**



### **Working Groups**



Working groups are dedicated 'summary' pages where the user can find documents, highlights, calendar events, 3W information, links and contact information – all pertaining to the working group/task force.

These pages allow information to be grouped by a combination of sectors, themes and geographic areas.

A working group is created by setting a name, description (optional), location, sectors (optional), chairing organizations (optional) and contact person information.

After the creation of the working group/task force, various items can be 'tagged' with it: documents, highlights, images, calendar events, etc...

### **Assessment Registry**
