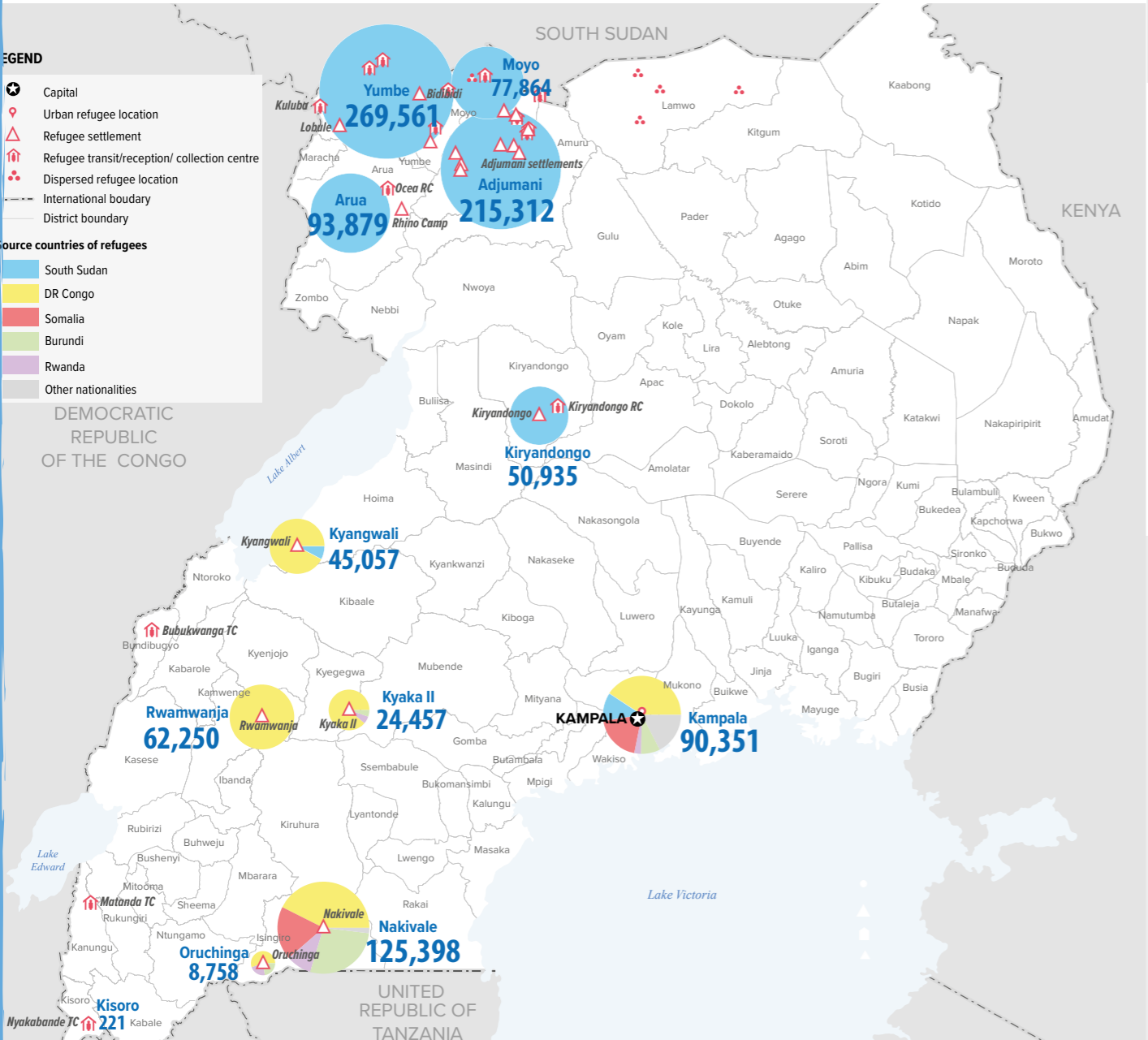
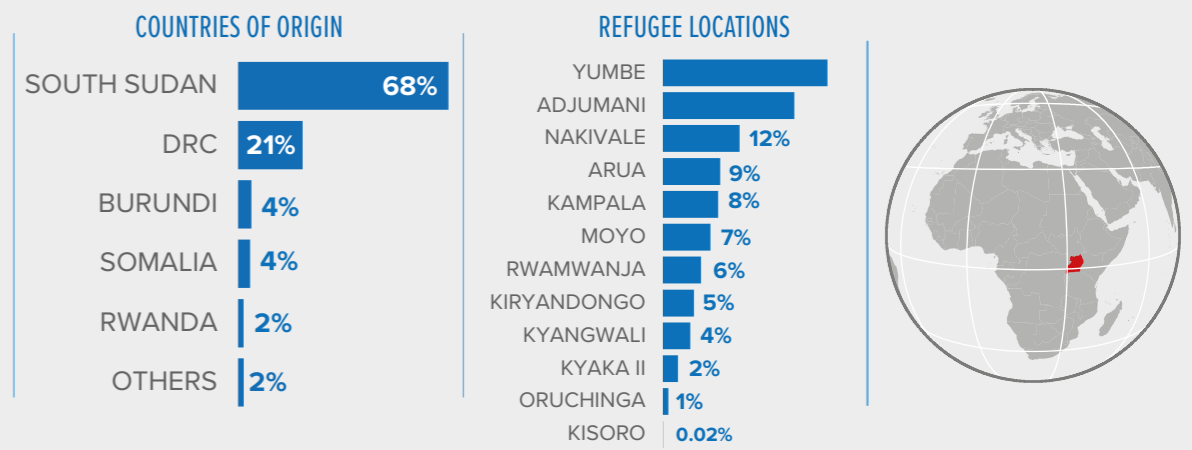



The Summary Overview Document of the Leaders' Summit on Refugees notes: "Uganda pledged to continue its settlement approach, providing access to education and legal employment for some 120,000 newly arrived refugees in 2016. Uganda's approach includes two new settlements, and access to employment, education and health care have already been identified. Uganda also pledged to use recently secured additional funding, including a \$50 million World Bank loan, to sustain and expand work on the Refugee and Host Population Empowerment framework, which aims to improve income and productivity for host communities and refugees."
