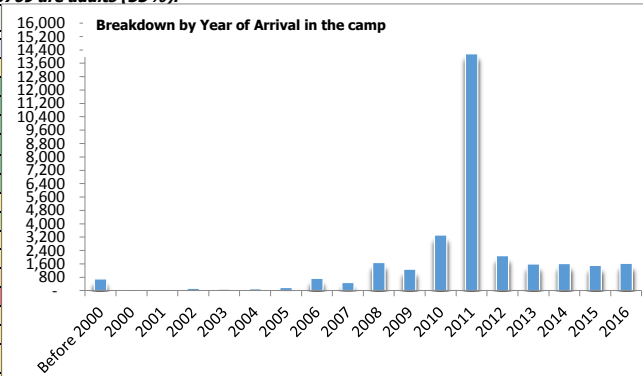

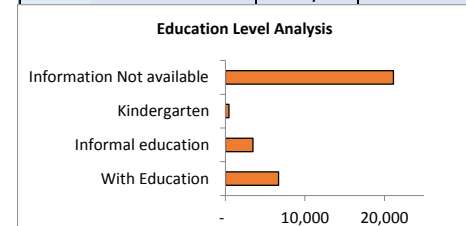

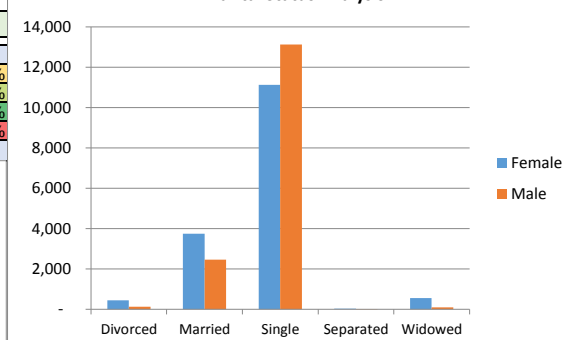

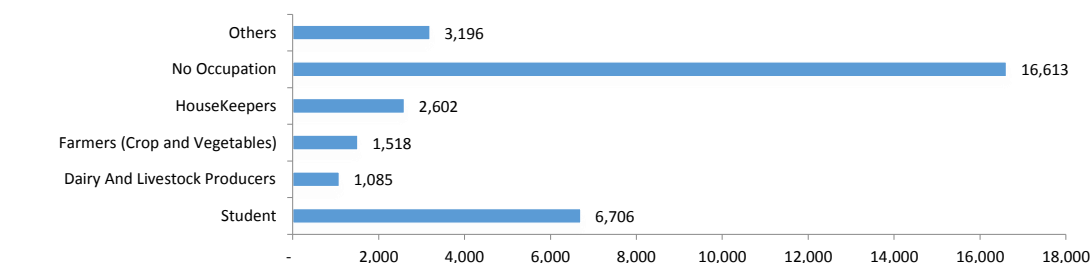


Marital Status Analysis



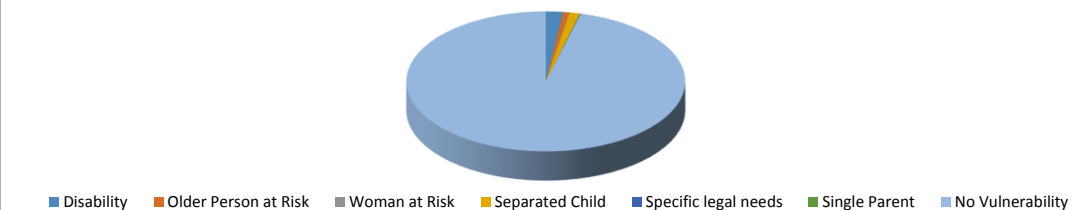

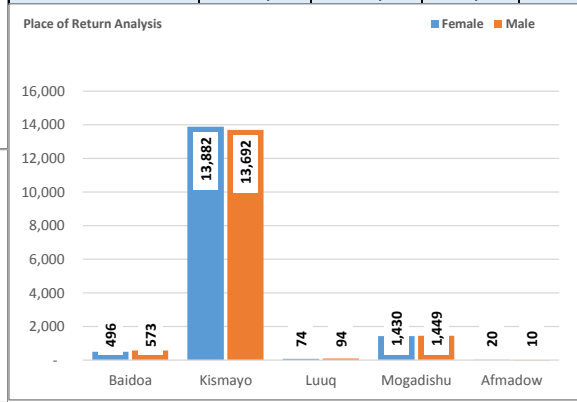

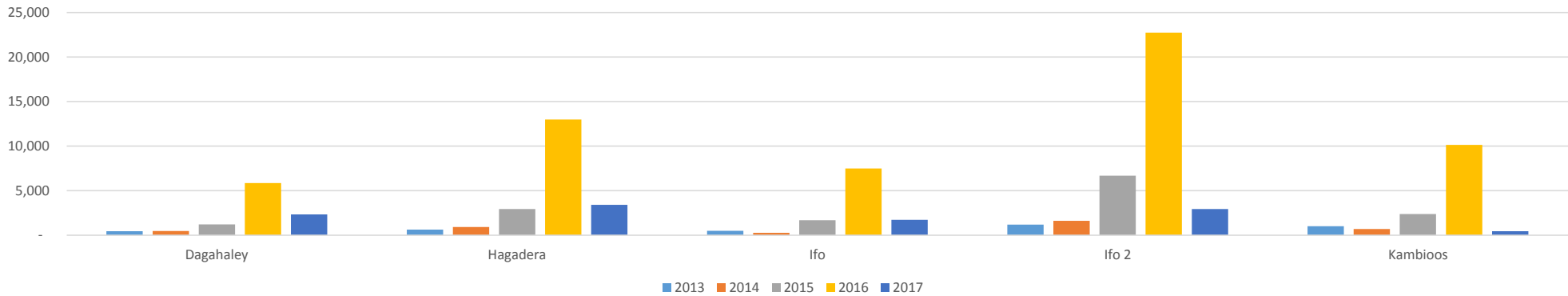

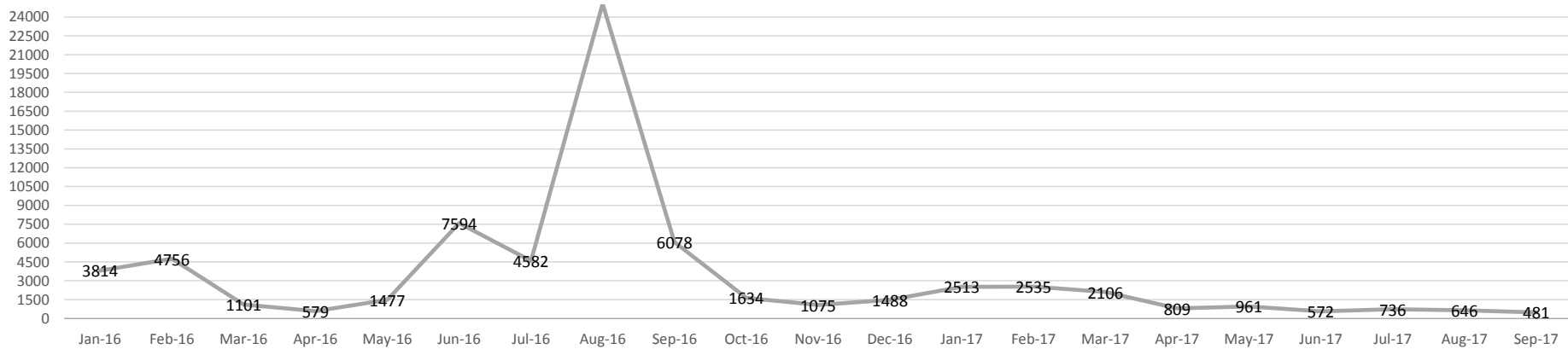

Trends of POCs Approaching the Return Help Desk per year per camp

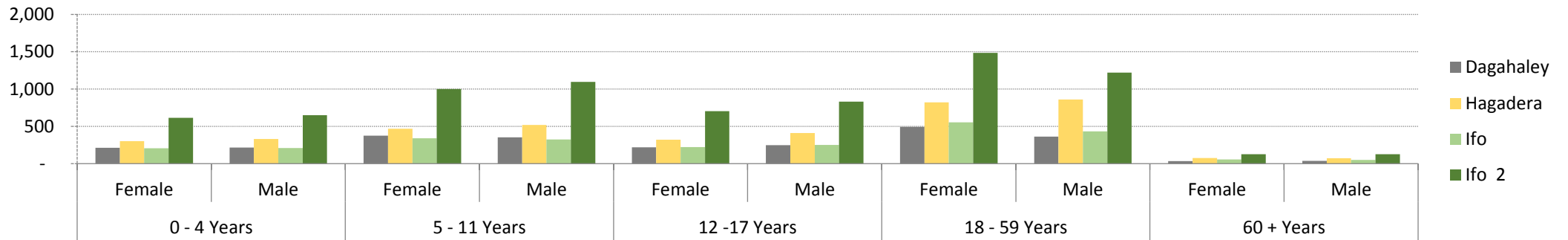


Trends of POCs Approaching the Return Help Desk between January 2016 and September 2017

Status	Total	From the launch of Return Help Desk in all Dadaab's camps at the end of November 2013; 93,284 PoCs were interviewed and 92,686 among them have expressed their intention to repatriate to Somalia. 71,034 Individuals have been repatriated to Somalia as of 15th September 2017. 4,423 have been inactivated in proGres database for No-show or spontaneous departure. While 17,229 refugees willing to return (in principle) remain active.
