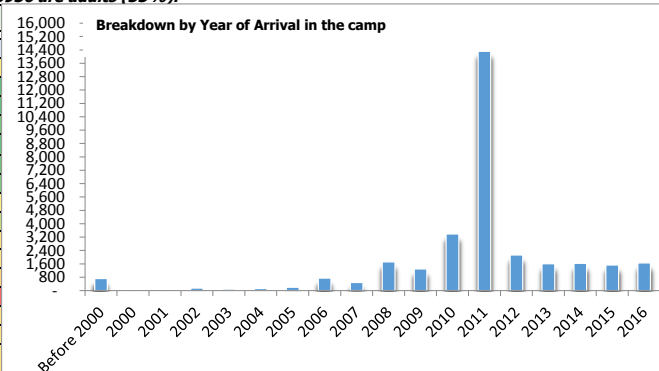

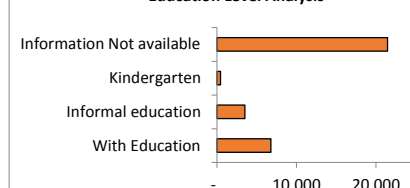

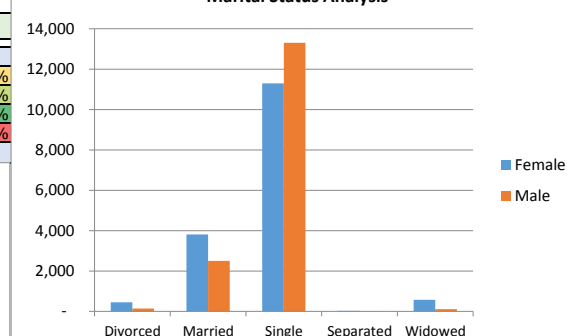

Education Level Analysis

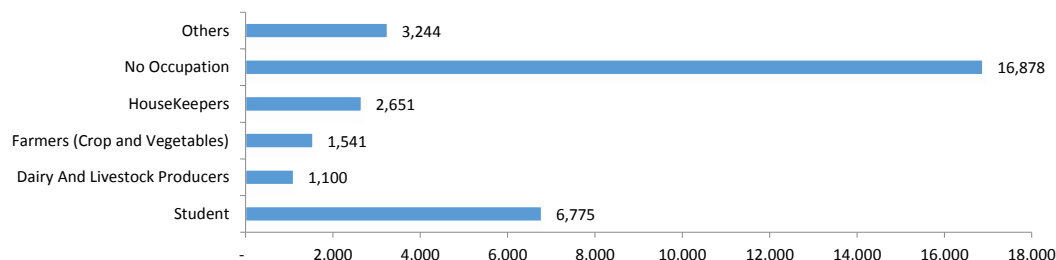


Marital Status Analysis



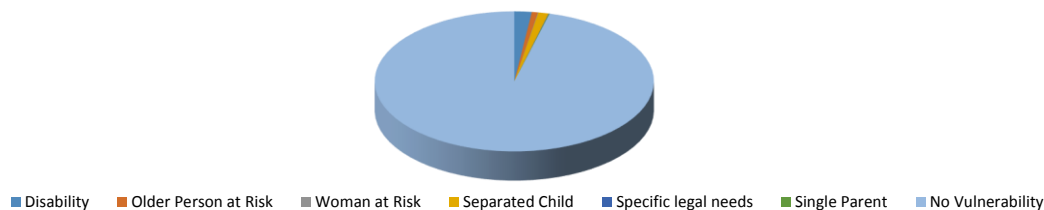

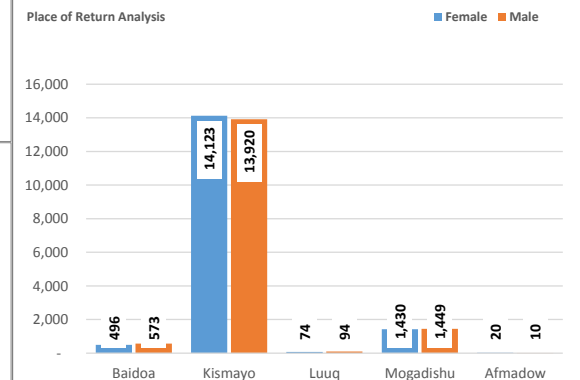

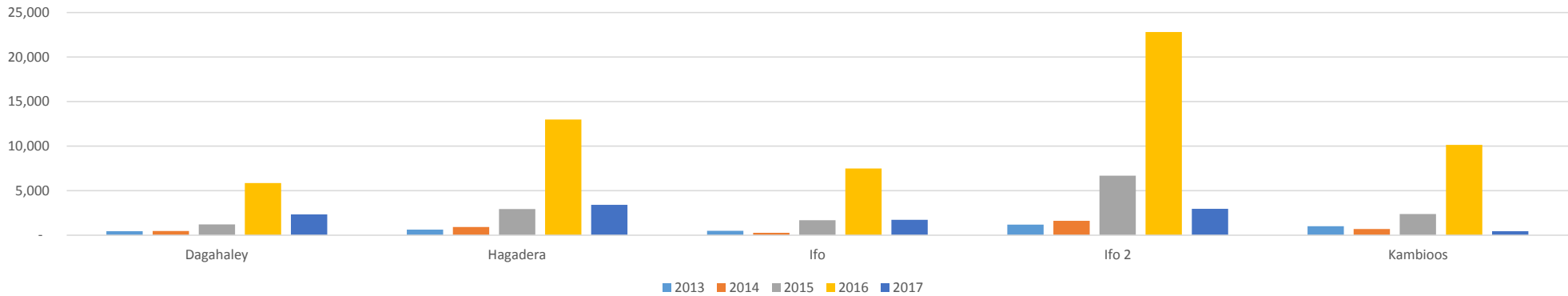

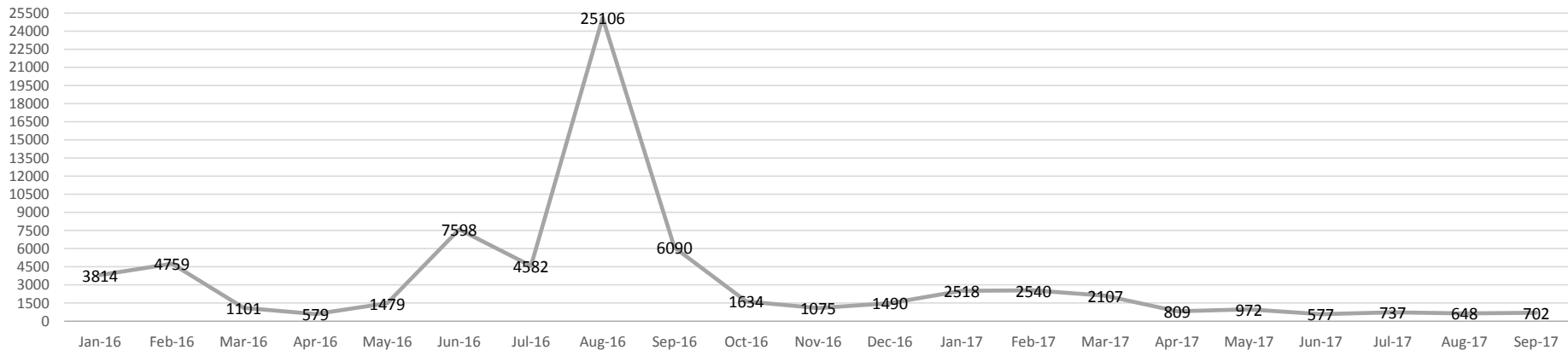

Trends of POCs Approaching the Return Help Desk per year per camp

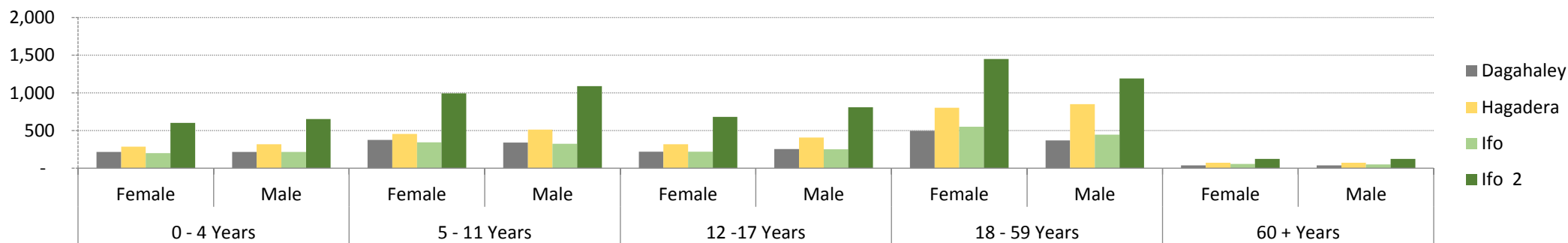


Trends of POCs Approaching the Return Help Desk between January 2016 and September 2017

Total Interviewed	93,624	From the launch of Return Help Desk in all Dadaab's camps at the end of November 2013; 93,624 PoCs were interviewed and 93,026 among them have expressed their intention to repatriate to Somalia. 71,503 Individuals have been repatriated to Somalia as of 30th September 2017. 4,494 have been inactivated in proGres database for No-show or spontaneous departure. While 17,029 refugees willing to return (in principle) remain active.
