





### Key findings

Angwan Masallaci host community has not ever received any sort of assistance from any humanitarian organisation. There is urgent need for food in the host community. The school available in the community lacks basic learning and teaching facilities. The students have to sit on ground to receive lessons. Therefore, there is need for educational facilities to enable the students have a conducive atmosphere for learning. There are number of widows among the IDPs who needed assistance.

### Key findings

The IDPs in the host community are in need of cooking fuel, and other NFI materials. The most common cooking fuel used are firewood and charcoal. They lack both and as a result, the children are sent far distance to fetch firewood. In the process they become victims of sexual attacks. Additional educational facilities is needed and teachers are needed in the existing school in the host community. Pupils sit on a cracked floor in order to attain lessons. The latrines of the school are in a bad condition. Teaching and learning material is also lacking.

No any humanitarian agency presence in the community. There is a malaria outbreak in the host community and there is no clinic. Establishment of medical facility is highly demanded. In the meantime there is the need for malarial drugs. The only primary school Umar Suleiman Primary School in the area is serving more than one community of over 4000 population and is in poor condition and lack adequate teachers, learning and teaching materials.

### Key findings

NFI material is needed in the community. Empty sack filled up with dried grasses serve as a mattresses. The children wear torn clothes. The IDPs in the host community are using the latrines as bathroom which is not hygienic as it can lead to outbreak of diseases. There is needed for separation of latrines from bath room and sensitization on importance of water sanitation and personal hygiene.

### Key findings

Inadequate supply of shelters as some families live in improvised shelters under trees. Some make a shelters from various materials which cannot protect them during the raining seasons. The latrines are without floors therefore remaining dirty that emanates pungent smell. There is a need for sensitization of the IDPs on personal hygiene and environmental sanitation.

### Key findings

Latrines are urgently needed as they are inadequate. The available ones are not hygienically fit for use. There is need for additional teachers and repairs of the existing facilities. The only available primary school has only three teachers. To support the livelihood farm tools, fertilizers and seedlings are required. Many of the shelters are makeshifts and therefore need to be reinforced with tarpaulins.

The current ratio of the teachers per students is one teacher to over 100. only four teachers available in the whole primary school with the population of 450 pupils. Open latrine is used by the IDPs in the host community. This is dangerous as it could lead to the case of SGBV.



## Key findings

There are two primary schools in the ward owned and managed by the Government. The school environment is not conducive for the children to study. This is because the classrooms don't have chairs, desks and other learning/teaching facilities. The school is in not well managed. The school is in bad condition as it has no doors and windows, the blackboard faded and the floor of the class is cracked. There are two hospitals in the community owned and managed by Government. However, it is not affordable by the IDPs. More water point is need and/or the repair of the broken down borehole. The only two water sources are one borehole and one well but the borehole is not currently working.
