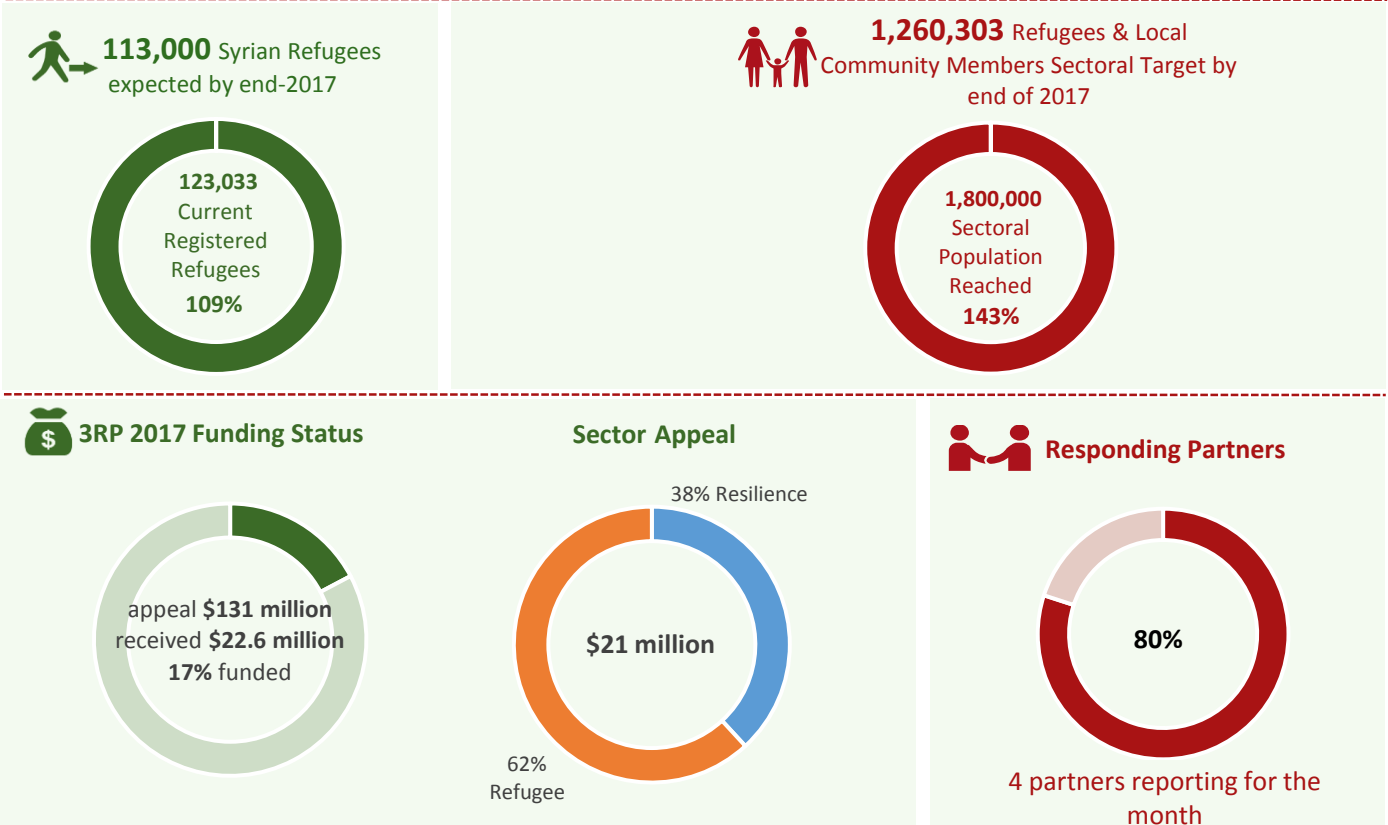




During the reporting period, 1,315 education enquiries were responded to from refugee families with school age children. Approximately 28,226 refugee children (14,410 Boys & 13,816 Girls) applied for the education grant for the new academic year 2017/2018 starting soon. 21,478 students (10,196 Boys & 10,562 Girls) were served with the grant to cover their tuition fee, books, stationary, uniforms and pay for safe transportation. In addition to that, approximately 1,129 UASCs (585 boys & 544 girls) were assisted with financial assistance in order to be able to enroll in all stages of education for this academic year. During this period, 18 schools received assistance in terms of upgrading WASH facilities in preparation for the new academic year and 1000 MoE teachers were trained by 3RP partners. A programme of capacity building to MoE staff working with Syrian refugees was implemented focusing on Peace Building, Hygiene and classroom management to maximize the protection space available to both refugees and host community children in public schools.

Approximately 269 refugee youth continue to receive support and enroll in all Egyptian public and private University. For this academic year 2017/2018, an additional 87 DAFI higher Education Scholarships were secured for Syrian refugees in Egypt by the German Federal Government. In addition to that, some 66 Syrian refugees have just successfully completed 100 hours on English Language studies in Mansoura University under the HOPES/ EU Madaad Funds.
