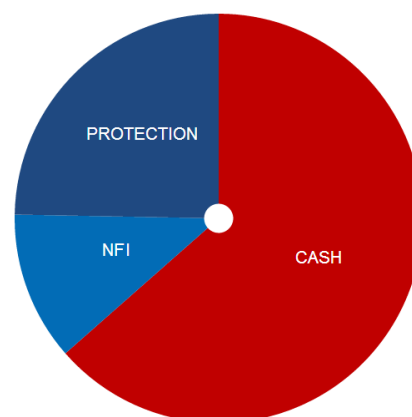
CARE International

Mission

CARE is a leading humanitarian organization fighting global poverty. Care places a special focus on working alongside poor women because, equipped with the proper resources, women have the power to help whole families and entire communities escape poverty. CARE also delivers emergency aid to survivors of war and natural disasters, and help people rebuild their lives.

In Jordan, CARE intervenes in the Protection, NFIs and CASH sectors, in both camp and non-camp settings.

Additional Sector Information

In addition, CARE is partnering with UNHCR, preparing for the opening of another camp for Syrian refugees in the vicinity of the central eastern city Azraq. CARE has established four community compounds that will provide services to up to 50,000 refugees out of a total 100,000 refugees that are envisaged to populate the camp over the course of 2014. Within the camp, CARE is the designated leader for community mobilization, information dissemination, case management and the provision of referrals to the relevant service providers. Furthermore, on arrival of the refugees, CARE ensures all arriving refugees receive key information in an easily digestible manner, with the aim to facilitate access to and knowledge of all services available to the camp inhabitants.

In Azraq town, safe spaces are installed on the premises of two local CBOs and the CBO teams are being trained to plan and implement different types of psychosocial activities, in particular peer support groups.

In 2014, CARE plans to intervene in Amman, Irbid, Zarqa, Mafraq governorates, Azraq town and refugee camp.
