





The following map shows the most commonly used roads and tracks in-and-around Batil, Gendrassa and Kaya camps. Dotted lines show tracks used by refugees to walk between the camps and access some host community villages. Their locations were mapped by REACH surveyors on the ground. The map was produced to support UNMAS work in the camp.
