

# Tunisia: Mixed Migration Profiling , Key Findings

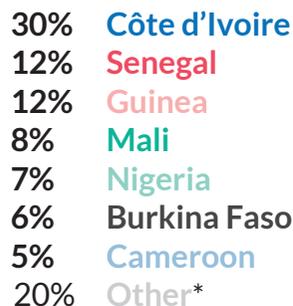
## INTRODUCTION

In 2017, 1,660 new arrivals within mixed migration flows were referred to the Tunisian Red Crescent in Southern Tunisia (Medenine).

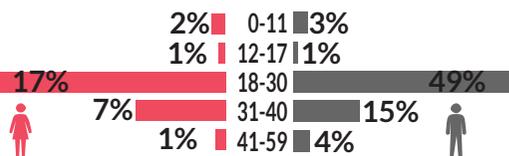
Since October 2017, all new arrivals have been systematically profiled by UNHCR and partners using Kobo profiling system, for a total number so far of **346** individuals, with the following findings”.

## POPULATION PROFILE

### Country of Origin



### Demographic Breakdown



Most arrivals remain young single men (18-30 years old), travelling alone; with only 18% of new arrivals accompanied by family members. Increased ratio of women who represented more than 40% of new arrivals in the first quarter of 2018, compared to 14% in 2017.

## Entry points to Tunisia



**67%** of new arrivals transited through Libya before arriving to Tunisia.

## Length of stay in Libya



**92%** of individuals who transited through Libya experienced violence or abuse. Reported abuses include torture, ill treatment in detention, violence, SGBV, kidnapping, being held for ransom, being sold for labor, and robbery.

## Future intentions

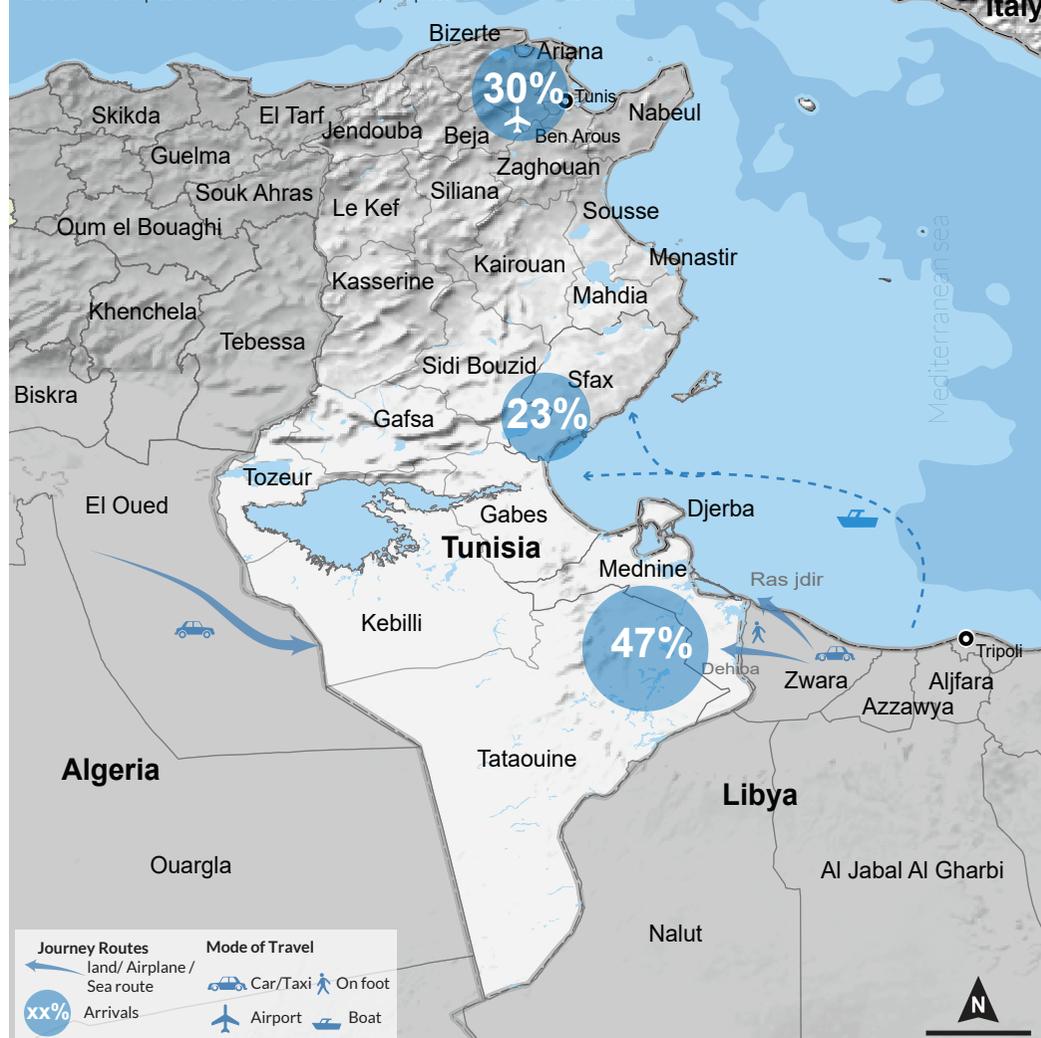
- 30%** Returning to country of origin
- 27%** Remaining in Tunisia without seeking asylum
- 16%** Undecided
- 15%** Seek asylum in Tunisia
- 12%** Onward movement

## Push factors

### Top three reasons for departure from country of origin

- 
- 1** Economic hardship/poverty/ lack of employment
  - 2** Generalized violence/war/ conflict
  - 3** Violence in the community or at home
