To continue to address the needs of persons fleeing Yemen in receiving countries, the Regional Refugee and Migrant Response Plan (RRMRP) for 2016 brings together the respective country plans of Djibouti, Ethiopia, Somalia and Sudan, co-led by UNHCR and IOM. The RRMRP covers the requirements to provide protection and assistance to those fleeing Yemen into Horn of Africa for 2016. While there is also movement of people from Yemen into the Gulf countries, the GCC countries are covering their needs and as such are not included in the Plan.





Other Countries: Over 4000 Yemenis have registered in Morocco, Jordan and Egypt in 2015 (as of Sept), as well as 285 in Malaysia (as of June). 1708 Yemenis have registered in 38 European countries and 6 non-European countries (end of Oct), which is 2.2 times more than the same period in 2014.

REGIONAL STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES

1. Refugees, migrants and returnees fleeing from Yemen have access to safe, humane movements, and access to territory and asylum, enabled through a harmonized, comprehensive and coordinated approach in the region to identify persons in need of protection and assistance.
2. Affected populations, especially vulnerable populations and those with specific needs and those faced with protection risks, have access to protection and assistance upon arrival, regardless of their migratory status, and enjoy a dignified stay in the country with access to basic services and freedom of movement.
3. Refugees, migrants and returnees have access to durable solutions such as regularization of stay, voluntary return and reintegration, local integration, resettlement for vulnerable individuals with specific protection needs, as well as promoting labour mobility schemes.
4. Strengthen partnerships (at national and regional levels) to address the complexities of mixed migratory flows and promote dialogue and cooperation among source, transit and destination countries as well as support existing coordination mechanisms with regional organizations and initiatives (IGAD, EU, AU, GCC, OIC, Khartoum process, and Sana'a Declaration).

The RRRMP Monitoring Framework is used to monitor the impact and output of the regional strategic objectives. The detailed plan is included in the RRRMP document and regular progress updates will be shared in 2016.
