HIGHLIGHTS

Duhok: Core Relief Items (CRIs) were provided to meet the needs of the newly relocated families to Domiz 1 camp. Replenishment of heating stoves: 5,955 refugee families received replacement heating stoves (5,404) and various NFIs (551) in Domiz-1 and 2 refugee camps. Heating stoves were replaced due to the inferior quality of previously distributed stoves and recommendations of the 2016-2017 Post Distribution Monitoring. The 551 families received NFIs based on needs assessments and referrals by several UNHCR and Camp Management protection teams.

Sulaymaniyah: Winter distributions were completed in December, however following an additional assessment, 489 families were in need and received heaters. Also, storms in February caused flooding in the camps, though the damage was minimal, tents and Core Relief Items (Plastic Sheeting) have been replaced for the families whose homes were damaged. Repairs to communal infrastructure are ongoing. In total, 506 refugee families received Core Relief Items.

Erbil: Following field and Camp coordination assessment mechanisms, families in the four camps were identified and received Core Relief Items for replenishment of torn or used items.

NEEDS ANALYSIS

In Duhok, 522 calls on the refugee hotline were received, for requests or complains. The majority of these requests were related to need for cash, mainly for medical expenses followed by shelter and Core Relief Items. In Domiz camp 1 complaints box, 1,003 complaints were lodged, the majority of which were about food and CRIs. The received complaints were directed to the relevant organizations for follow up.

In Erbil, 11% of the 531 calls from refugees on partners' complaints hotline concerned requests for Core Relief Items (CRIs) and winter clothes. 50% of the callers requested financial support for general purposes such as health, cash for milk and diapers, cash for food, education, debt, shelter and transportation.
