






Number of Syrians by Province

Highlights

- On 13 Feb 2013, the Government Agency for Disaster Management AFAD reported that the total number of Syrians registered in 17 camps in Turkey increased to 181,729 persons (8% increase since end Jan 2013) including 182 Syrians who are undergoing medical treatment in hospitals. The estimated number of non-camp Syrians in Turkey is estimated to be minimum 100,000 people, bringing the total population of Syrians in Turkey falling within the temporary protection regime to be 281,729 people.
- During the last 24 hrs. (12-13 Feb) 1,517 Syrians were admitted from the borders while 161 Syrians returned to Syria voluntarily.
- According to the official figures from Harran Container site in Şanlıufa province the camp population has nearly reached full capacity (9,353 persons) in almost 1 month. Reportedly the new arrivals as well as those temporarily accommodated in communal centers in Nizip town will be gradually transferred to the newly opened camp site in Adana province.
- In consultation with the Turkish Red Crescent/Kizilay, the 'Disaster and Emergency Management Presidency' of the Turkish Government' and UNHCR, WFP has developed a detailed expansion plan for the first 3 months of 2013. The expansion plan includes an initial additional caseload of 17,500 beneficiaries in early March in Harran Camp (10,000 population), Osmaniye Düziçi Camp (2,500 population), and Nizip2 Camp (5,000 population) where household cooking facilities are being put in place, and shops expected to be operational in two-week time. This will bring the total number of beneficiaries of the food e-card programme to 40,000 by the end the March while other camps are identified for further expansion.
- UNHCR Field team will be visiting the camp site in Adana share its technical expertise and will continue to work together with the officials. With regards to UNHCR's presence in the vol-rep interviews , a schedule will be decided and planned tin coordination with the camp officials.
