




HIGHLIGHTS

In winter 2015-2016, across Lebanon 90,717 girls and boys under 15 living in Informal Settlements, received a one-off cash assistance of 40 USD to support their families to cope with the deteriorating living conditions and the additional burden of winter climate exposure. Based on the lessons learned from the previous year, UNICEF decided to focus primarily on cash assistance as a more empowering and dignified form of support.



Age Category Number of assessed children by age category







A total of 90,717 children living in 27,411 households benefited from the programme. The average number of children per household was 3.3 children, ranging from 1 to 23. 94% of the children were registered with UNHCR. Out of the total children population targeted, 871

The distribution of ATM cards to the beneficiaries was conducted by WFP Cooperating Partners in two rounds, the first round between the 15th and the 23rd of December 2015, and the second round between the 27th and the 31st of January 2016. The households that had already received a card for WFP's food voucher programme received only a PIN (17,077 households), the others got both an ATM card and a PIN (4,951 households). Some cases were not included in the distribution since they had received a card and a PIN

previously from the Lebanese Cash Consortium (5,383 households).

The considerable majority of ATM cards and PINs were



Round 2 was conducted for the cases that were assessed in the latest stages and to require a second change for the Ne show cases from the provide a second chance for the No-show cases from the first round. Additional No show distributions were organized to ensure the maximum rate of distribution. Finally 94 per cent of the identified beneficiaries received their card and the assistance.




Distributed vs not distributed per round

ASSISTANCE

After distribution, an SMS confirming the activation of the card and availability of the cash was sent after Round 1 of distribution, between the 25th and the 30th of December 2015 and on the 5th of February 2016 after Round 2 of distribution.

27,411 cards (90,717 children) were loaded with a total of 3,628,680 USD, with an average of 132 USD per household.

Most of the UNICEF beneficiaries were entitled to other assistance such as Multi-Purpose Cash Assistance (by UNHCR and Lebanese Cash Consortium-LCC) or UNHCR's winter cash assistance. 6,154 cases received only UNICEF's cash assistance.
