EXPLANATORY NOTES:

SUMMARY:

This matrix is prepared and published weekly, representing what happened in various sectors in the particular reference week. This indicators matrix is a step towards showing a comprehensive picture of the current situation in Uganda (West-Nile) and establishing a basis for initial trend and gap analysis. In order to better understand the matrix, following are the explanatory notes on some of the sector indicators:



PROTECTION:

Rhino: During the reporting period, a total of 194 (101 M 93 F) PSNs, and 79 PSNs, in 40 households, who had been held in Ocea reception centre due to various conditions have been relocated to appropriate plots in the settlement and offered the basic necessary support. 120 (72 M, 48 F) separated children, 07 (05 M, 02 F) unaccompanied minors (UAMs), were identified at reception center, and 46 (23 M, 23 F) Best Interest Assessments were conducted. 03 (00 M 03 F) foster care arrangements were made for 05 (04 M, 01 F) UAMs.

Adjumani: No new cases of PSNs were reported during this week. However LWF carried out comprehensive assessment of 150 persons (60 male and 90 female) with specific needs settled in Pagiriny, most of them are in need of material support and shelter.

Yumbe: SGBV Note that indicator 'SGBV incidents' refer exclusively to SGBV incidents reported and is no indicator for the total number of SGBV incidents occurred. PSNs: The total number of PSNs identified for the period 12 - 18 November were 789 PSNs (F 685 and M 104). The majority of PSNs identified were elderly persons and women at risk (single parents and pregnant women) and a few cases of disability.



HEALTH:

Rhino:
899 individuals were screened for medical conditions;
289 received de-worming tablets.
150 children were immunized against polio.
276 children were immunized against measles.
144 children aged 6 -59 months received Vitamin A supplements

Adjumani:
There are no reports of new case of acute watery diarrhea (cholera) in Adjumani host population since the 18th October. Medical and nutrition screening continued at Elegu Collection Point. Malaria remains the major cause of illness among new arrivals followed by injuries; watery diarrhea and respiratory tract infections.



WASH

Adjumani: The availability of water is 15.40 l/p/d in Pagirinya refugee settlement, while it is 41.10 l/p/d in newly opened Agojo settlement. The number of persons / latrine is 22 and 26 respectively in Pagirinya and Agojo Settlement. Similarly, the number of refugees per hygiene promoter is 342 in Pagirinya and 317 in Agojo. In Agojo water is being supplied through water trucking. Two boreholes have been installed and are in use. Similarly two boreholes have been casted and installed but will be in use starting next week. The installed boreholes have low yield.

Yumbe:

A total volume of 1410.8 m3 of water was supplied to the settlement this week through water trucking and 33 hand pumps. The average water supply indicator value was 9.9 l/p/d.

- Operation of the Obongi water treatment unit continued and it supplied an average of 304 m3/day but with some operational pumping issues.
- The piped water system by Water Missions Uganda became operational and it supplies water to parts of Zone 1 through 30 tap stands.

Rhino: During the reporting period 38,559 liter of water supplied to new villages, the water supply decreased to 6 L/P/D due to up growing of population and low capacity. 504 pcs of logs and 178 plastic slocs distributed to 84 household in Afoa-B and Luraja-C to support HH latrine construction. 4 water tanks sited in the new village, Amuro. One tank was replacement to a new one Afoa-B. Two hygiene sanitization/promotion awareness campaign conducted with purpose of how to promote environmental and personal hygiene and particularly for meat sellers that how they hygienically keep and seal meat, 60 meet sellers and other refugees attended the awareness in Luruja and Afoa-B.



NUTRITION:

Rhino: During the reporting period 206 children were assessed at Ocea Reception Centre for micronutrient deficiencies and malnutrition using Mid-Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) as follows: 07 children were diagnosed with Moderate Acute Malnutrition (MAM). 05 children were diagnosed with Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM).

Adjumani

109 children (from the age of 5 to 59 months) suffering from SAM have been undergoing treatment, while the number of moderately malnourished children undergoing treatment is 218. Generally the recovery rate of MAM is 71 % in Adjumani.



SHELTER

Rhino: A total of, 10, 682 household shelters have been constructed so for new arrivals;
In Eden I/ II/III/IV villages, 1,232 household constructed shelters for sleeping, is on average 3m x4m (12m2) accommodating average of 4 persons.

Adjumani: A total of, 10,323 household shelters have been constructed so for new arrivals;
In Eden I and II villages, 1,163 household constructed shelters for sleeping, is on average 3m x4m (12m2) accommodating average of 4 persons., which gives 4,652 persons (3.00m2/person).
