<p><u>Jordan Response Plan and Inter-agency appeal 2018-2020:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • MoPIC has shared the final draft of Jordan Response Plan 2018-2020 (JRP) and made online on the JRPSC website www.jrpssc.org. The education JRP remained the same in terms of key activities and required fund against its project summary sheets. • As of January 12th, the financial requirement of inter-agency appeal for education has been compiled for a total USD 161.397 million (USD 86,5 m for resilience) and (USD 74,8 m for refugee) from 32 organizations (27 INGOs, 1 NNGO and 4 UN). • Activity Info database reporting training will be conducted by UNHCR on 22,23,24 and 29 January 2018. <p><u>JRP 3 pillars updates: Access, Quality and Systems Strengthening:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enrolment: MoE is still finalizing the enrolment data for 2017-2018 enrolment through its EMIS system. • Access, Quality and System Strengthening: <p>Cumulative reach in 2017 were extracted from the only Activity Info within the framework of JRP 2017 with following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Access: A total 6,421 children accessed certified non-formal education through catch up classes (3,179) and drop out program (3,242.). <p>AoB (Any other Business):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Needs Assessment Task Force met twice on 13 December 2017 and 11 January 2018 to review sample of education questionnaires from other countries. The Task Force produced the first draft of Rapid Assessment Tool. Sharing education initiatives including lessons learnt were encouraged through ESWG forum to improve capacity of sector members. MoE confirmed that school registration would be only extended for certified NFE Catch Up in the second semester. UNICEF will conduct campaign for school retention and key messages for the enrolment of Catch Up. World Vision Japan/Jordan was wondering to check if English version of PTA Guideline was available to be used for its current proposal development. The 2017 monitor database are officially closed for all users.
