# Coordination Review

LCRP Steering Committee meeting in November 2017, the members agreed to launch a review of the coordination architecture of the LCRP in 2018.

The HC/RC has since held a number of consultations with stakeholders in order to present a proposal for the way forward as promised to the Minister of Social Affairs. Linked to this, the inter-sector is conducting a partner survey and all partners engaged in the work of the sectors, both at national and field level, will be asked to provide their feedback through this survey by mid-February.
