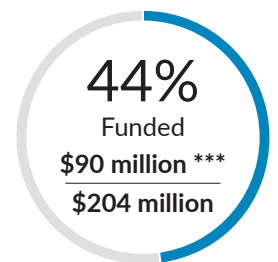
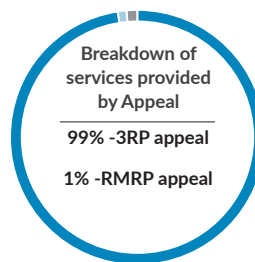
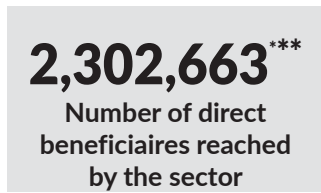
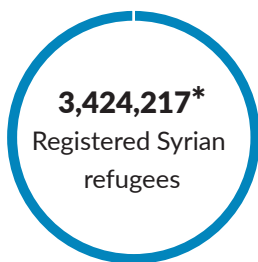




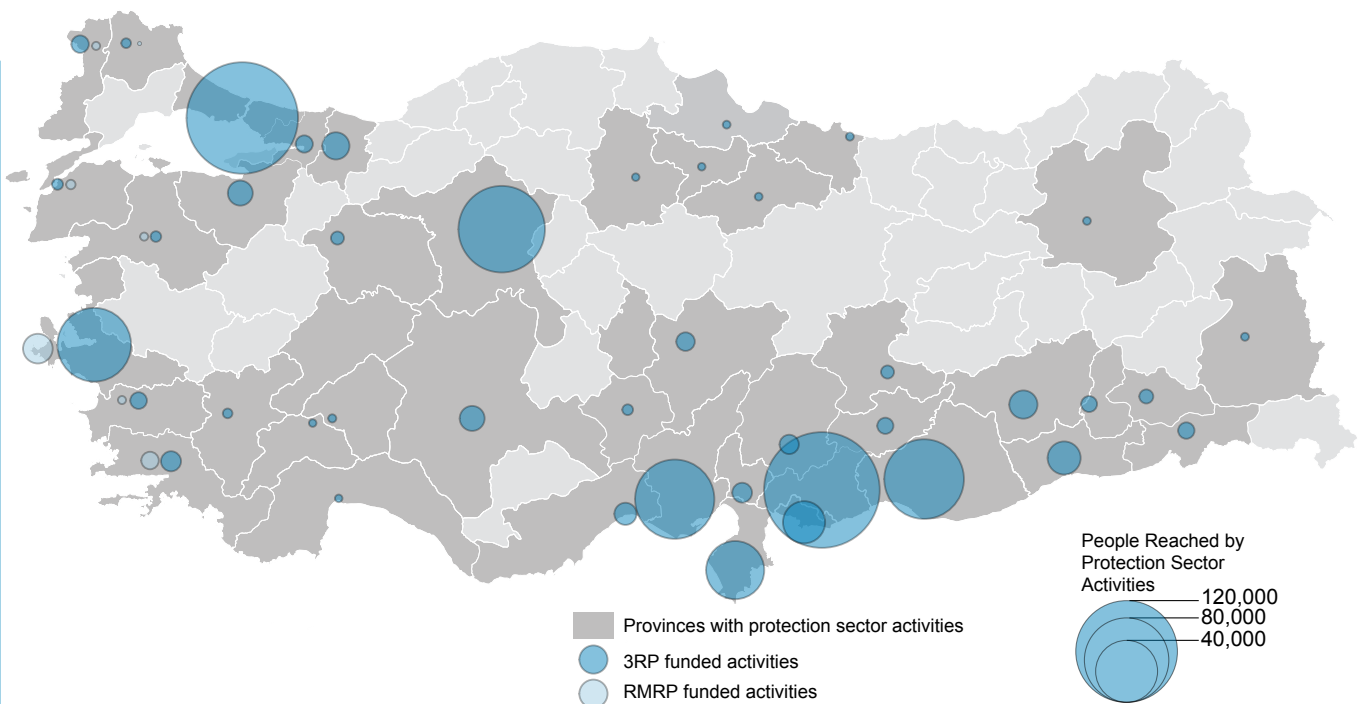
HIGHLIGHTS

Protection sector actors have been working to engage both refugee and host community members, facilitating dialogue on key protection issues and establishing wider networks for communication with communities. As an example, in December, UNHCR undertook focus group discussions with over 1,000 refugees and asylum-seekers in South East Turkey, Central Anatolia, Istanbul and Izmir. Key issues identified included promoting social cohesion, increased communication and information dissemination, ensuring meaningful access to services and access to livelihoods.

To facilitate meaningful access to justice, sector efforts focused on capacity and coordination support with the Ministry of Justice (MoJ) and Court personnel. Over 250 judges of administrative, civil and criminal courts benefited from international refugee law trainings and more than 125 staff of the MoJ participated in workshops on international refugee law. In December 2017, an international conference on access to justice for refugees, was held in Ankara, bringing together judges, lawyers, policy makers and academics to share perspectives and experiences to enhance refugees and asylum-seekers' access to justice.



3RP COUNTRY COVERAGE



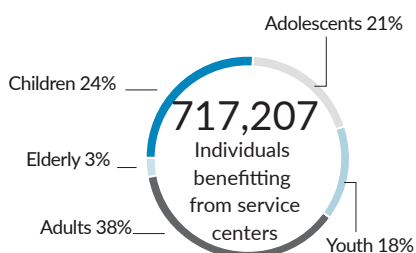

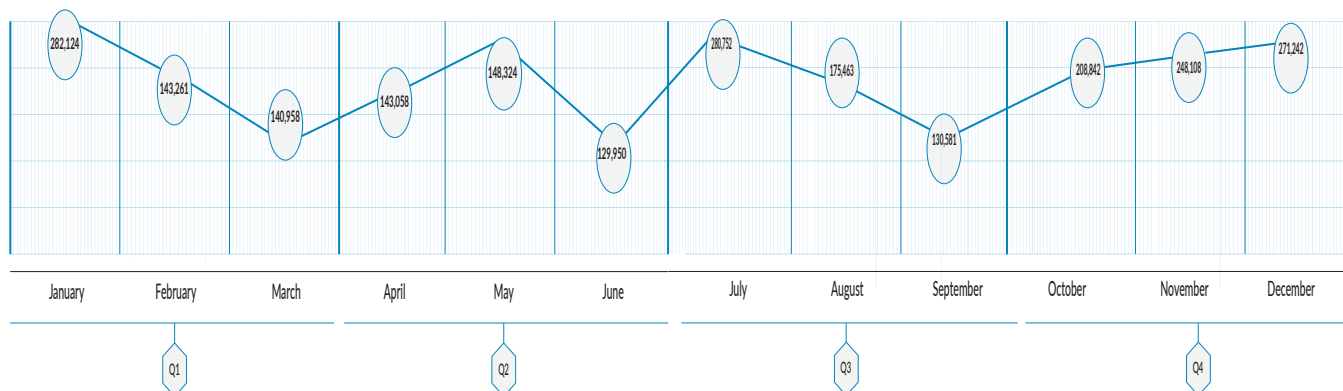
