



## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees


## **Highlights**

- On 14 January 2014, AFAD the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 213,232 including 119 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 13-14 Jan 2014, a total of 554 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 555 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- It was reported by the local officials in Kilis that due to increased fights near Azaz and surroundings, reportedly the authorities informed that they observed an increase in the number of arrivals through both officials and unofficial crossings. The local officials also informed that due to increased fights, in Azaz (across Kilis), the number of IDPs also increased in Bab Al Salame and it is estimated to be about 16,000 persons.
- In Adiyaman, camp officials informed UNHCR that the registration of the camp residents is almost completed; however so far only about 25% of the registered residents were provided the new ID cards, Reportedly the camp management will continue to use the former registration data base (AFKEN). The officials stated that they will also register the Syrians linving outisde of the camp in the host communities.
- The school admistration in Adiyaman camp informed that they have about 2,901 students (29% of the camp population is attending the school classes). Reportedly the schools are closed for a week so the children can study for the mid-term exams.
- In Mardin, local officials stated that more than 100 persons were sent from Viransehir to Nusaybin camp. UNHCR met with the new arrivals and most of them claimed to have arrived from various places in Syria including Aleppo.
- In addition to the 5 camps (Akcakele, Ceylanpinar, Adiyaman and Kahramanmaras) where UNHCR will provide prefabricated clinics, in consultation with AFAD, another 5 more clinics will be built in towns for non camp Syrians. AFAD Hq requested the clinics to be built in Kilis, Sanliurfa, Gaziantep and Reyhanli as well as another location is still pending to be decided by AFAD.
