

## Working with Partners

- UNHCR liaises with the Government of the UAE and has mobilized resources for a number of operations, regional situations and for activities stemming from the Global Compact for Refugees (GCR). UAE donated USD 31.5 million in 2018 to UNHCR's operations in Yemen, as well as USD 2 million for emergency nutrition, to UNHCR's operations in Bangladesh. UAE continues to fund GCR-related projects in Uganda in the fields of education, livelihoods and the provision of sustainable water supplies.
- As part of the Abu Dhabi Sustainability Week in January 2019, UNHCR participated in the World Future Energy Summit, organised by the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA). Through engagement in such events, UNHCR is building new partnerships in the renewable energy sector, to support persons of concern.
- The UAE Government continues to fund warehouses and office space for UNHCR's Global Stockpile, in the International Humanitarian City in Dubai, and has undertaken four airlifts in response to the situations in Myanmar (1), Indonesia (1) and Ethiopia (2).

## **Main Activities**

### **Protection**

- UNHCR welcomed the series of visa reforms announced by the Government in 2018, notably the granting of amnesties and of renewable visas to a number of people from conflict-affected countries who had been residing irregularly in the country. While the amnesty helped many people secure regular residence, some continue to have difficulties accessing basic services and securing employment.
- In 2018, UNHCR registered 7,663 individuals as persons of concern. Over 95 per cent of registered persons of concern in UAE are from Syria and Iraq (7,441 out of 7,674) but these reflect a small percentage of the estimated 250,000 Syrians and 100,000 Iraqis in the country.
- UNHCR has started a referral process for prioritized registered individuals seeking protection interventions, including regularization of their visa status; the process continues to be discussed with authorities.
- UNHCR provides cash assistance to the most vulnerable persons of concern. In the most recent distribution, 398 individuals received quarterly financial assistance.
- UNHCR works closely with immigration and law enforcement authorities to identify durable solutions for persons of concern who are either in detention centres or are detained at airports. UNHCR is advocating for more systematic coordination between different stakeholders.
- In 2018, UNHCR organized eight capacity-building activities, primarily for government officials from across the seven emirates, but also including representatives from semi-governmental organizations, media outlets and academia. The workshops raised awareness of UNHCR's mandate, and sought to establish and improve referral mechanisms between UNHCR and relevant government bodies. A further eight capacity-building activities are planned for 2019.

### **Durable Solutions**

 In 2018, UNHCR submitted 74 cases (195 individuals) for resettlement, while 21 individuals were resettled.
