World Refugee Day has been marked on 20 June, ever since the UN General Assembly, on 4 December 2000, adopted resolution 55/76 where it noted that 2001 marked the 50th anniversary of the 1951 Convention relating to the Status of Refugees. Since then, the international community remembers millions of displaced people on this day. With events and initiatives around the world, we commemorate the courage of displaced people fighting for their livelihood, better life and inclusion in the host communities.

In 2016, UNHCR launched the **#WithRefugees** campaign and petition as a way for the public to show their solidarity and empathy with people forced to flee. The petition asks governments to:

- · Ensure every refugee child gets an education.
- Ensure every refugee family has somewhere safe to live.
- Ensure every refugee can work or learn new skills to make a positive contribution to their community.
