


SITUATION OVERVIEW

Over 742,000 Rohingya refugees have fled violence from Myanmar's Rakhine state since August 2017 and are hosted in Bangladesh. Most of the refugees rely on humanitarian assistance, having left with few possessions and exhausted their financial resources during the journey.


More than 912,000 Rohingya refugee women, men, girls and boys are hosted in Cox's Bazar District, including 34,172 registered refugees who arrived in the 1990s (4%); and other unregistered Rohingya refugees who had settled in host communities prior to August 2017. Children make up 55% of the total refugee population and women and girls make up 52%. One in three refugee families have at least one easily identifiable protection vulnerability. Whilst the pace of arrivals has decreased, refugees continue to arrive in Bangladesh, as of end of July 2019.

The dashboard monitor the monthly achievements of selected indicators from the 2019 country operation plan for each strategic area of activity with cumulative key figures and monthly highlights.


GEOGRAPHIC SITUATION




POPULATION KEY FIGURES

POPULATION TRENDS





PROGRESS AGAINST 2019 TARGETS

ACHIEVEMENT (JULY 2019)

- 110,535** refugees participated in the joint Government of Bangladesh-UNHCR registration exercise in this reporting month.
- 1,452** refugees and **256** community leaders attended awareness raising sessions while **16** monitoring visits to detention centres were conducted in this reporting month.
- 53** refugees with disabilities received specific support, since May 2019.
- 5,435** complaints received under the community-based complaints mechanism and **3** new community groups were supported in this reporting month.
- 1,592** adolescents and youth received services while **99** UASCs were identified and documented in this reporting month.
- 483** partners, government and UNHCR staff trained on SGBV prevention and response while **508** survivors of SGBV incidents received psychosocial counselling in this reporting month.

ACHIEVEMENT (JULY 2019)


- 51,333** primary health care consultations and **409** deliveries conducted by skilled attendant in health facilities in this reporting month.
- 292** mental health consultation conducted and **22,845** refugees participated in group psycho-social activities in this reporting month.
- 830** new admissions to community management of acute malnutrition programmes reported in this reporting month.


WASH

-  **41,617** WASH facilities assessed during a sweep survey
-  **61,688** WASH hygiene kits distributed
-  **24,246** tube well and latrine maintenance conducted (repair, renovate, decommission and desludge)

ACHIEVEMENT (JULY 2019)

- **28** WASH facilities (Latrines) constructed in this reporting month.
- **5,582** WASH facilities maintained in this reporting month, including **779** tube well and **4,803** latrines.
- **141** waste bins and waste pits installed in this reporting month.

-  **25** kilometers of roads and pathways, **32** kilometers of drainage, **19** kilometers of retaining structures, **12** kilometers of steps and **1.6** kilometers of bridges constructed
-  **88,361** pre-monsoon shelter tie-down kits distributed
-  **86,706** * shelter padlocks provided

PROGRESS AGAINST 2019 TARGETS

ACHIEVEMENT (JULY 2019)


- **9.5** kilometers of infrastructures constructed during this reporting month, including **2.4** km of roads and pathways, **0.4** km of bridges, **1** km of steps, **4** km of retaining structures, and **2** km of drainages.
- **7,096** shelter repair and replacement assistance provided in this reporting month.
- **1057** pre-monsoon shelter tie-down kits distributed in this reporting month while **580** shelter padlocks were distributed since January.

-  **24,561** host community households have been visited during LPG distribution assessment

PROGRESS AGAINST 2019 TARGETS

ACHIEVEMENT (JULY 2019)

- **3,699** households received LPG cylinder while LPG refills were distributed to **72,143** families in this reporting month.
- **606** host community households received LPG cylinder while **2,047** host community households were visited during LPG distribution assessment in this reporting month.
- **3,769** refugees received environmental education since the month of June.


NFI & SITE MANAGEMENT
KEY FIGURES

-  **16** camps managed by site management support agency partners
-  **84,518** female/menstrual hygiene kits distributed

PROGRESS AGAINST 2019 TARGETS

ACHIEVEMENT (JULY 2019)

- **92** households received core relief items during this reporting month.
- **623** female menstrual hygiene kits distributed to women age 12 to 59 year old during this reporting month.

-  **2,028** host community households are continuing their livelihood intervention with TUP* projects
-  **3,475** host community and **1,173** refugee households are continuing their livelihood interventions
-  **707** host community and refugee households enrolled for skill development training for ensuring their self-reliance

ACHIEVEMENT (JULY 2019)

- **2** peaceful coexistence project completed during this reporting month.
- **4** host community households and **673** refugee households have initiated their livelihood interventions while **2,028** are continuing their livelihood intervention with TUP projects in this reporting month.
- **31** host community and **6** refugee households enrolled for skill development training for ensuring their self-reliance in this reporting month.
