C.2 National Authorities

Capacity of national authorities to prevent and combat human trafficking and migrant smuggling in Sudan as well as protection of victims strengthened.

Training and technical assistance on the phenomena of mixed migration and management of such flows, including legal guide lines and legal procedures applicable to irregular migration. Training support on investigation techniques, evidence gathering, preparation of prosecution for cases of trafficking.

Target group – government and front line officials and irregular migrants as well as trafficked and smuggled. Based on a needs assessment, provide training to criminal justice practitioners on the identification, investigation and prosecution of human trafficking and migrant smuggling cases, and on the assistance and protection to human trafficking victims and vulnerable migrants throughout the country, with an emphasis on Eastern provinces.

Develop training modules on trafficking in persons and smuggling of migrants for Police and Judicial Capacity building on refugee and antitrafficking laws and their intersection and implementation challenges for relevant national authorities in Khartoum and Eastern Sudan, Feedback provided shared with the NCCT. Material support provided to these authorities to prevent and intercept trafficking and smuggling networks.

NB: As there is some overlap here between UNODC and UNHCR Capacity building with FCPU on child trafficking, kidnapping and cases of smuggling.
