

SIERRA LEONE - KEY COUNTRY STATISTICS



FGM PREVALENCE RATE

The estimated prevalence of FGM in girls and women (15-49 years) is 91% (DHS 2008). This appears to have reduced by 3% from 2006 (MICS 2006).

The statistics from the MICS 2006 survey suggested the prevalence of FGM in girls and women within the 15-19 age group was 81.1%, which appeared to be 16.4% less than FGM prevalence in the 35-39 age group which was estimated at 97.5% (MICS 2006).

Figures from the DHS 2008 survey suggest a 10% difference in FGM prevalence between girls and women (15-49 years) who live in urban and rural areas, with estimated FGM prevalence at 85% and 95% respectively (DHS 2008).

The most prevalent type of FGM practised in Sierra Leone is Type II. (US Department of State, 2001). *The DHS does not collect data on type of FGM performed in Sierra Leone.*

The Sierra Leone government to date has not passed legislation that prohibits the practice of FGM (MICS 2006; UNFPA).

Temne 35%, Mende 31%, Limba 8%, Kono 5%, Kriole 2% (descendants of freed Jamaican slaves who were settled in the Freetown area in the late-18th century; also known as Krio), Mandingo 2%, Loko 2%, other 15% (includes refugees from Liberia's recent civil war, and small numbers of Europeans, Lebanese, Pakistanis, and Indians) (2008 census)

RELIGIONS

Muslim 60%, Christian 10%, indigenous beliefs 30%

LANGUAGES

English (official, regular use limited to literate minority), Mende (principal vernacular in the south), Temne (principal vernacular in the north), Krio (English-based Creole, spoken by the descendants of freed Jamaican



slaves who were settled in the Freetown area, a lingua franca and a first language for 10% of the population but understood by 95%)
