

NIGER: Attacks and population movements in Diffa region (as of 8 June, 2016)

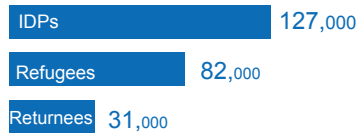
Since February 2015, around 115 security incidents have been recorded, leading to the displacement of more than 240,000 people in Diffa region. An upsurge of Boko Haram attacks has taken place since April 2016. In May and beginning of June, five Boko Haram attacks took place in the department of Bosso (including 2 against the IDP site and village of Yebi).



On 3 June, hundreds of Boko Haram insurgents launched the deadliest attack against a military position in Bosso: 26 soldiers and 55 insurgents were killed and 112 wounded, according to the Niger Government. On 6 June, Boko Haram attacked Bosso for the second time, in three days. As a result, the population fled to safer areas in the western part of Diffa region, leaving Bosso, Yebi and Toumour.

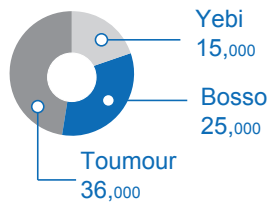
DISPLACEMENT¹

NEW DISPLACEMENT²

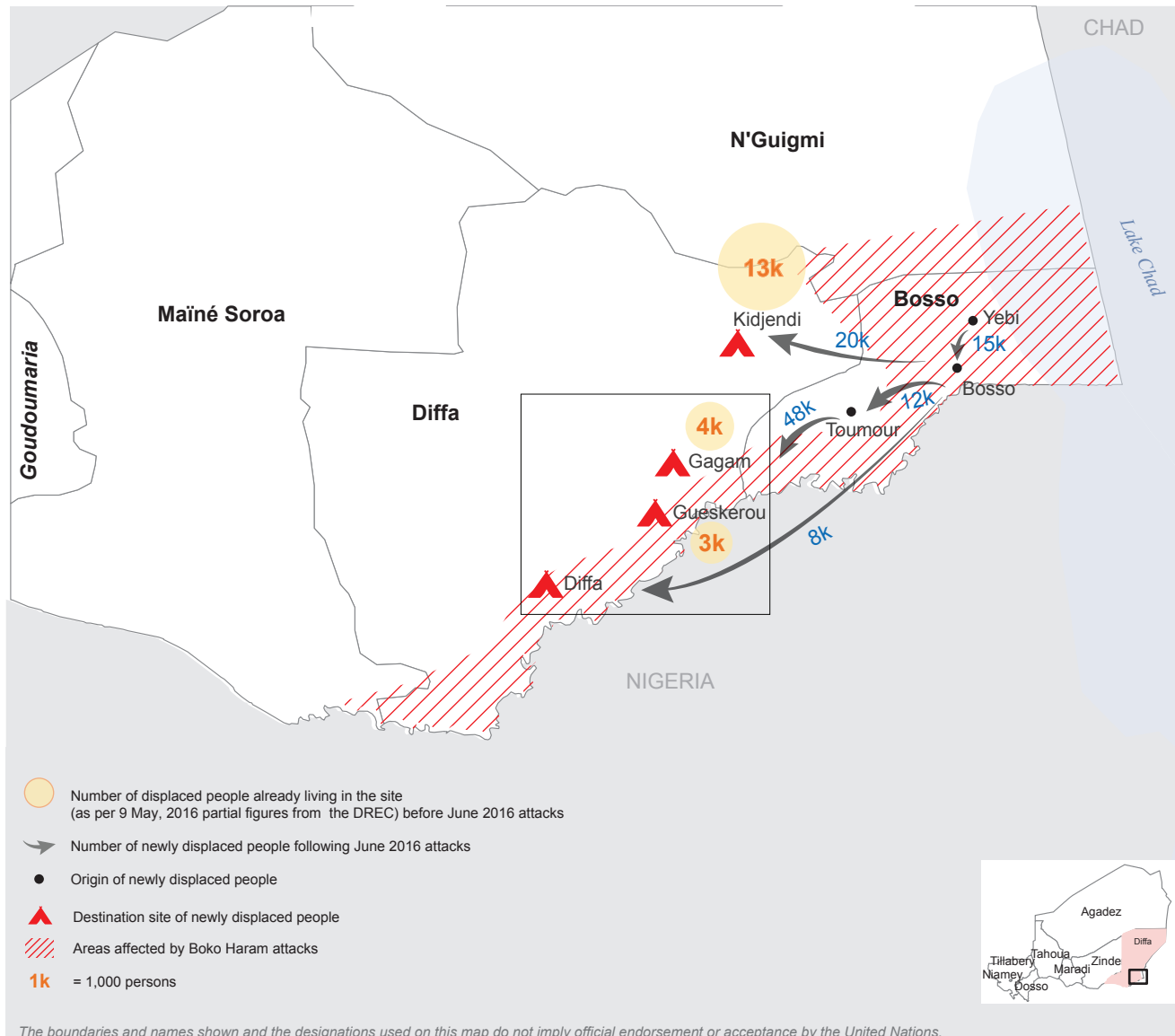


2. Estimated people displaced from Bosso department following attacks in June 2016

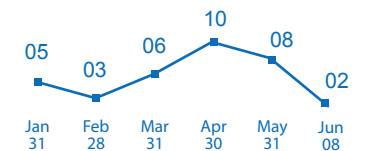
