German Intervention

Ladies and gentlemen,

Germany aligns itself with the EU Statement.

Application and follow-up of the GCR are indeed the task of the <u>international community as</u> <u>a whole</u>, which is clearly reflected in Draft 3 and should be kept in the final Draft of the GCR.

We would like to point out three suggestions for this agenda item:

- We thank you, Assistant High Commissioner, for your opening remarks on the process towards developing an indicator framework for the First Global Refugee
 Forum. A transparent monitoring framework will be important for a meaningful <u>stock-taking at the Global Refugee Forums and impact of the GCR</u>; and should therefore be in the interest of all of us. A reference to the process leading towards the development of a follow-up framework should be included in the final Draft of the GCR.
- We welcome the clearly spelled out way forward on the "impact mapping". In our view, the <u>discussions around the methodology and the actual results</u> of the impact mapping process will also be a crucial step in advancing and guiding the implementation and follow-up of the GCR.
- We note the reference to "<u>other processes and actions related to people on the</u> <u>move</u>". In particular, we reiterate our call for UNHCR to ensure coherence and synergies between the GCR and the GCM in the follow-up to avoid duplication of efforts.
- Lastly, references to SDG reporting and to the collection of disaggregated data by gender, age, race, ethnicity, migratory status, disability, geographic location and other characteristics should be promoted in the monitoring framework.

• We look forward to engaging in the envisaged process around follow-up and review arrangements.
