





118 individuals were registered the week of 5th -9th September 2011, 41 from Sudan, 16 from Somalia, 9 from DRC, 36 from Burundi, 14 from Ethiopian, 1 Eritrean and 1 from Uganda. As at 05th September 2011, the overall population in Kakuma Refugee Camp stood at 82,527.

The average family size registered during the reporting period stood at 2.03 individuals. Family size 1 households represented 65.5% of all newly registered households.

As at 03rd September 2011, the total South Sudanese returnee figure stands at **264** individuals, mainly from Upper Nile, Equatoria and few Bahr el Ghazal States.



NB: This report reflects registration trends. In addition to new arrivals reported here, the overall population in Kakuma also increases through new births, in-situ registration (of persons who arrived in a previous period but reported for registration later), family reunification, and various other data adjustments. Analysis and projections are based on actual persons registered in the UNHCR registration database (proGres)
