Stock-Take on the IASC Protection Policy and the Centrality of Protection

Objectives:

- Review experiences and observations on the degree to which we've made protection central to humanitarian action, since endorsement of the IASC Protection Policy, from the perspectives and vantage points of a range of actors.
- Identify future key actions -- and the actors who need to take them – to better achieve collective protection outcomes and support effective implementation of the IASC Protection Policy.

Outputs:

- A report (without attribution) for the IASC and wide dissemination that comprehensively reflects the substance of discussions and sets out key areas for future consideration.
- A basis for follow up actions that may be encouraged/adopted during the stock-take discussions or beyond, such as:
 - Recommended actions to HCs, Heads of Mission/Country Directors, Cluster Lead Agencies, and other actors
 - Commitments for follow up discussions among smaller groups of actors, to take forth discussions at country level, etc
