Right to adequate housing

#### All phases of displacement / crisis

#### Key Actions

- 1. Undertake due diligence in design and implementation
- 2. Understand the legal framework and reality on the ground
- 3. Understand how tenure systems, arrangements and practices affect security of tenure for at-risk groups
- 4. Implement programmes to support security of tenure
- 5. Support protection from forced eviction
