Reviewing the HPC

- Changed from CAP to HPC (HNO, HRP) in 2013.
- Protection – good practices in HNO and HRP identified and shared.
- Annual HPC review workshops with global clusters and humanitarian partners since 2015.
- Global commitments on humanitarian development nexus and grand bargain.
- 2018 Workshop to review processes and outputs of HPC identified recurrent challenges.

Recurrent challenges in HPC

- Heaviness of the process;
- Weak inter-sectoral needs and response analysis;
- Lack of continuous monitoring of the situation, needs and response;
- Unsatisfactory prioritization process and criteria;
- Inconsistent approaches to multi-year planning;
- Delays and poor linkages between HNO and HRP.

Work streams to improve HPC

- Purpose of HRP – strategic planning tool and fundraising tool;
- Strengthening inter-sectoral needs and response analysis in the field;
- HRPs to be articulated around desired humanitarian outcomes;
- Establish collective monitoring and accountability framework;
- Capacity to implement the HPC.

Aim of work streams to influence changes in the 2020 HPC

Next Steps

- Work streams are beginning now with a view towards completing in time for next years HPC (2020)
- Global Protection Cluster and AoRs are part of the process.
