



IDP - Profile

- Approximately 90% of IDPs qualify as extremely vulnerable individuals.
- While difficult, it is possible to distinguish between an IDP and an urban migrant
- IDPs are worse off than the rest of the population
- Unemployment rates for IDPs are well below the national rates
- Water is in short supply, of low quality and often the cause of disputes with members
 of host communities and other IDPs.
- More than a third of IDP children lack access to education






