Emergency transit center in Agadez, Niger: providing shelter to Sudanese asylum seekers



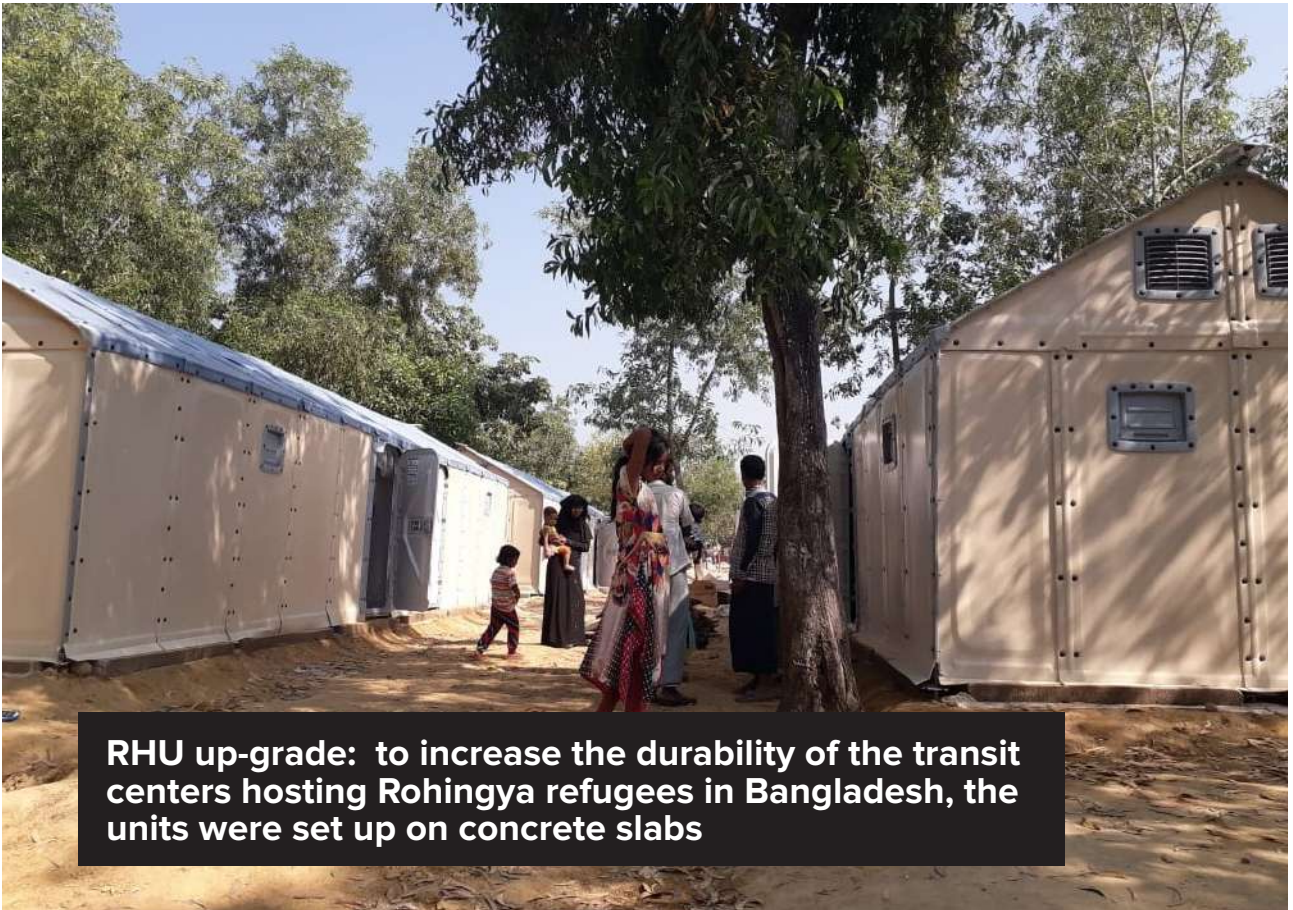
Emergency transit center in Niamey, Niger: providing shelter to extremely vulnerable refugees evacuated from Libya

Staff accomodation: for the personnel of Médecins du Monde, responding to the earthquake crises in Gorkha district in Nepal.



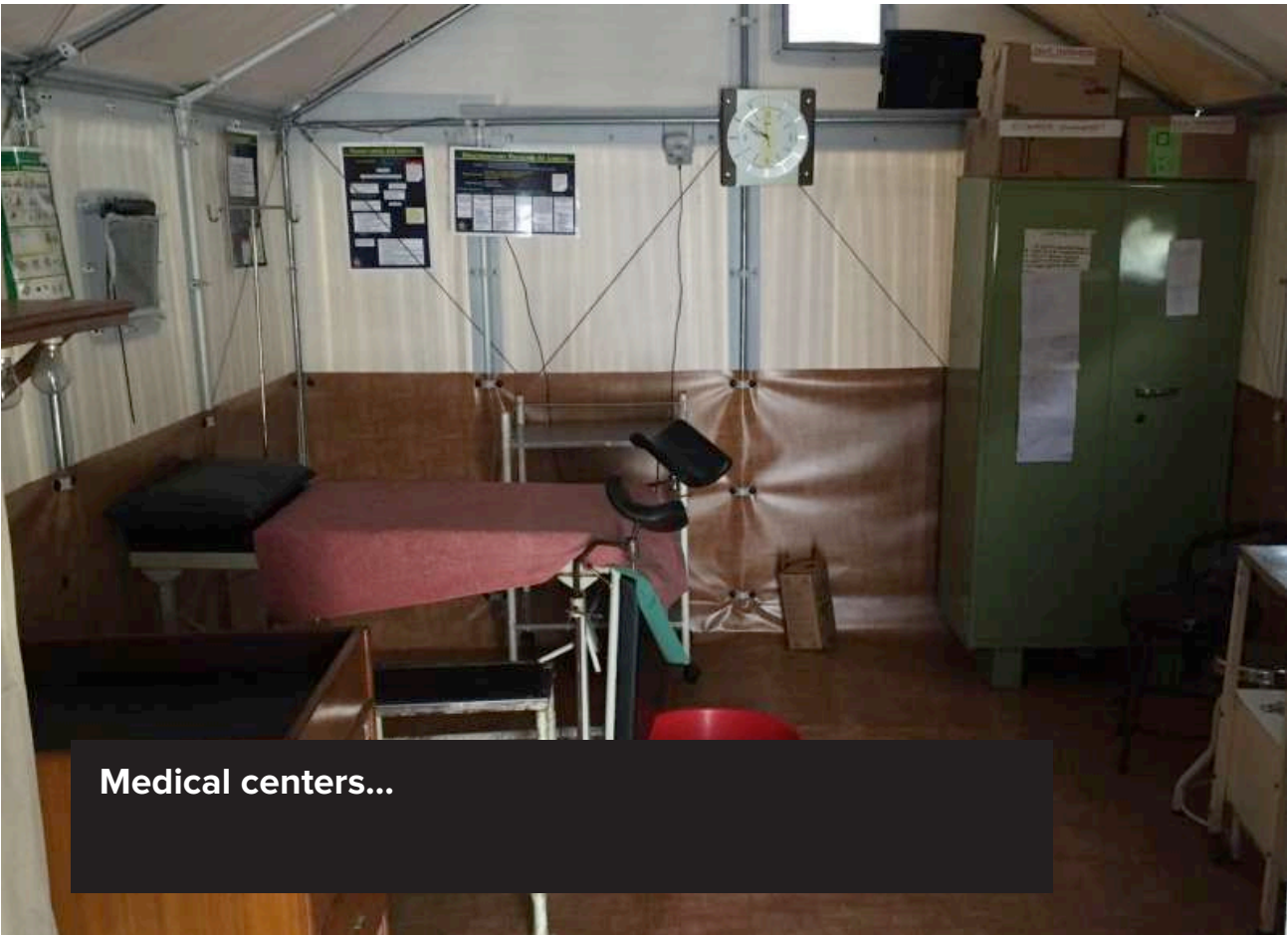
RHU up-grade: to increase the durability of the transit centers hosting Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh, the units were set up on concrete slabs



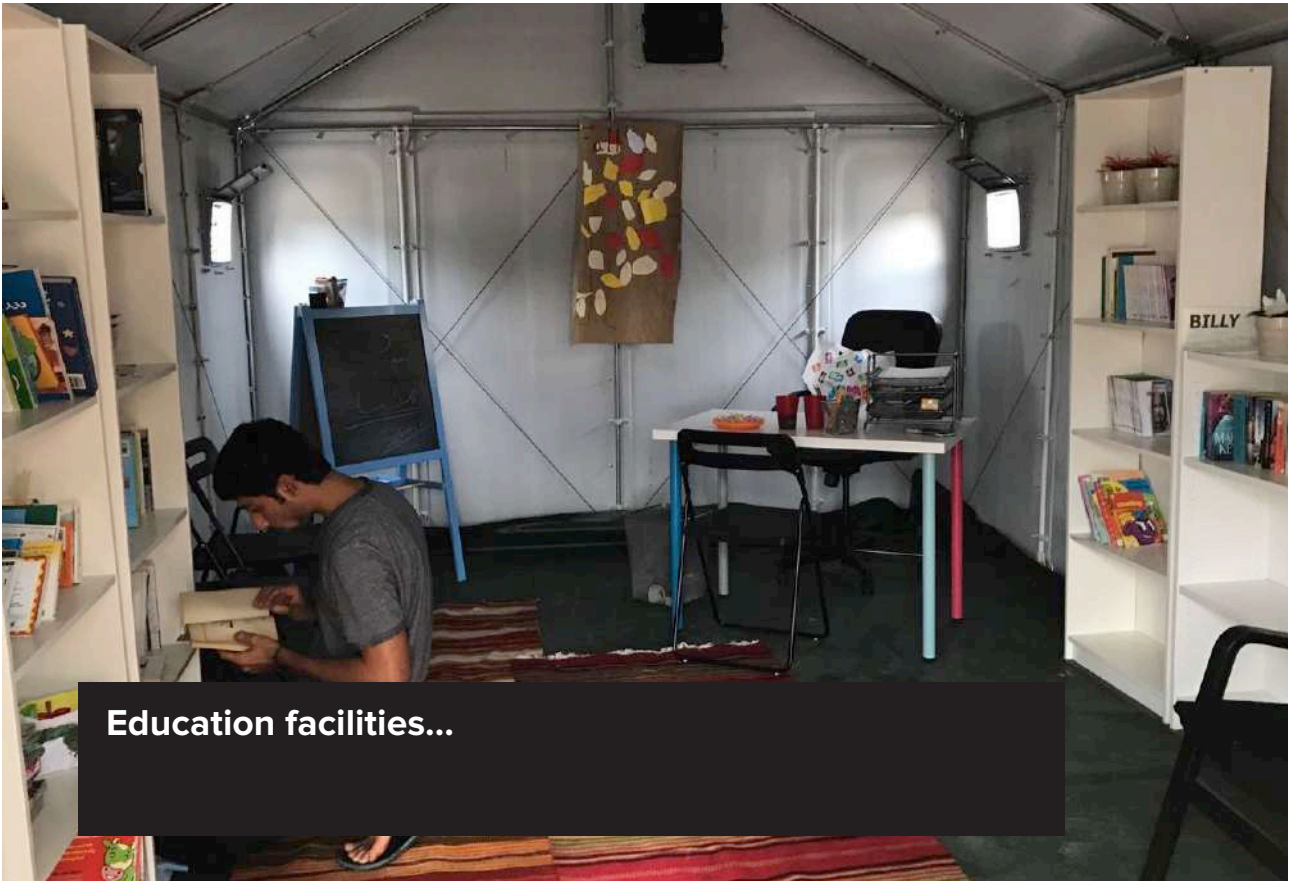
RHU up-grade: to improve the indoor ventilation of the units, additional doors and windows were installed in Boa Vista Brasil



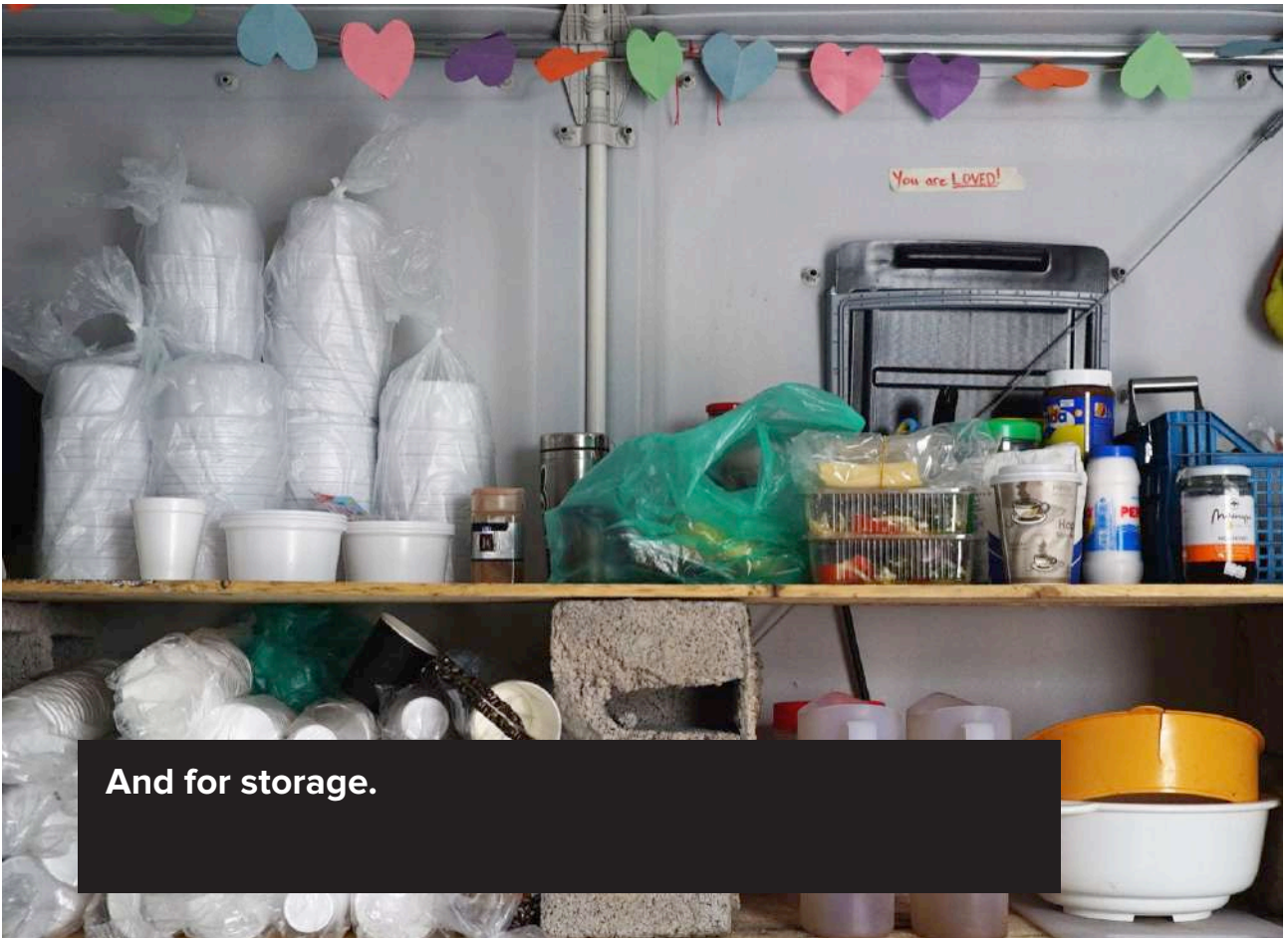

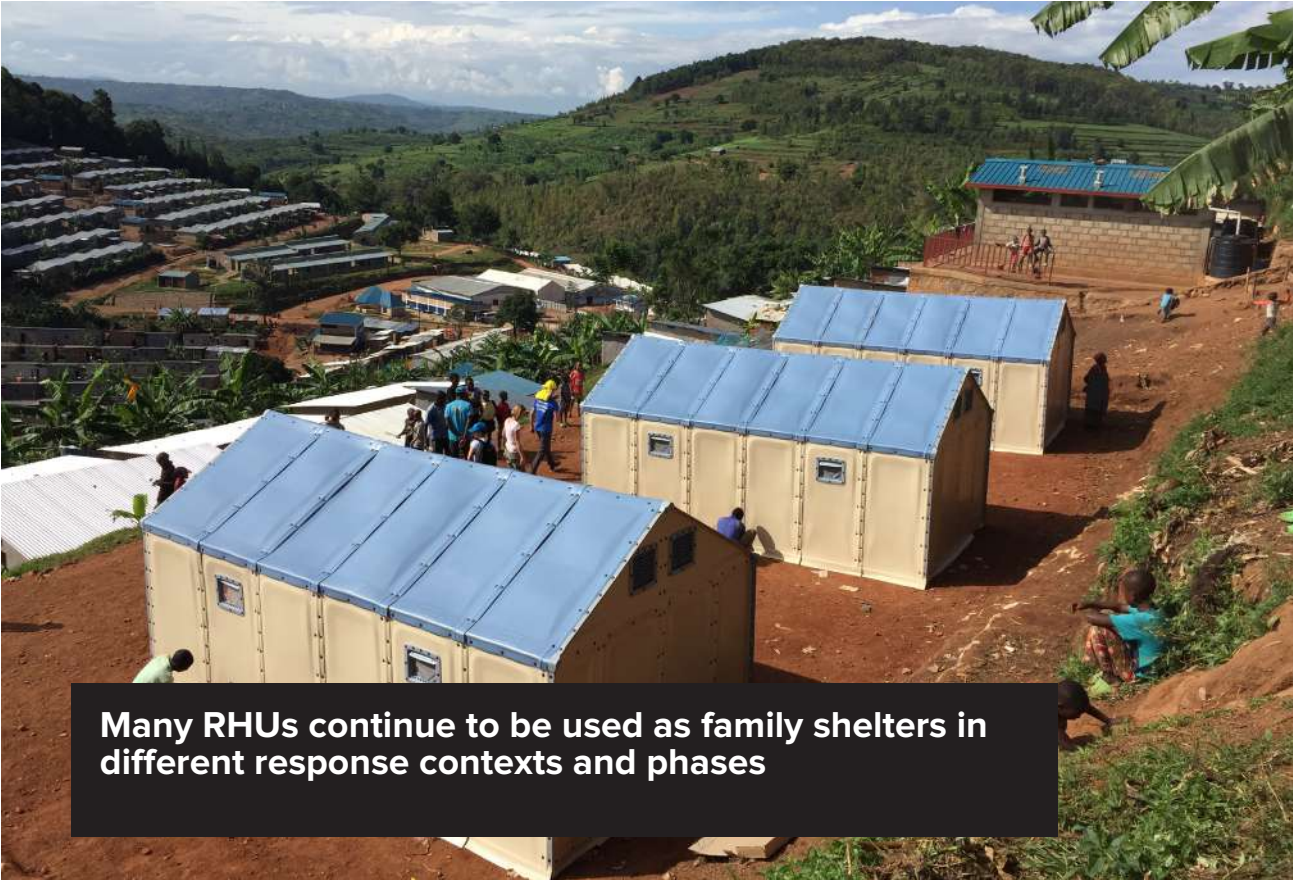
