Rapid Situation Report - Update No.2

Location(s):	North-Eastern Region
Situation / Needs:	<p><i>Badakhshan province:</i> The security situation has improved in Zebak and Ishkashim in comparison to the previous reporting period. 290 IDP families were displaced and based on the assessment conducted they will receive humanitarian assistance. Food and NFI items will be distributed in the coming days at Ishkashim district of Badakhshan province. In addition, the joint assessment team, (UNHCR/WAW, WFP/IDS, Focus and DoRR) identified 60 families required humanitarian assistance in Zebak district of Badakhshan province.</p> <p>Flood and heavy rainfall affected 244 families in Baharak, Yaftal Payan, Darayem, Argo, Shahr-i-Buzarg and Jurm district of Badakhshan. The joint assessment team (IOM, ANDMA, WFP, ACTED) assessed the affected families.</p> <p>IOM and WFP conducted an assessment in three insecure villages in Jurm district. The assessment indicated 256 families were affected by flooding. IOM has committed to providing NFIs and WFP will cover the food gaps.</p> <p><i>Kunduz province:</i> The joint assessment and response in Kunduz province is ongoing. So far 1050 families were identified as IDPs in different locations: Sher khan border 40 families, Khanabad 262 families, Kunduz city 748 families.</p>
Responses:	<p><i>Badkhshan province:</i> 244 families affected by flooding have received food assistance from WFP and, NFIs and tents from IOM and ANDMA .</p> <p><i>Baghlan Province:</i> On 7 May 2017, 85 flood affected families in Banu, Nahren, Pole</p>



	<p>khomri, Jelga, Khenjan and Doshion received food assistance from WFP and NFIs from IOM and ACTED. Their needs were assessed by different humanitarian organizations and governmental departments on 11 May 2017.</p> <p><i>Kunduz Province:</i> From 6 to 9 May 407 IDP families were recommended to receive assistance and received assistance during the period 12-22 May 2017 from different humanitarian agencies as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 407 females - food assistance from WFP - 102 females - NFI from SCI <p>SCI provided NFI and Hygiene kits for 102 Families, NRC provided 18,000 AFN/Family and DACAAR Hygiene Kits for 305 Families. The remaining 539 families will be assisted in the coming days.</p> <p><i>Takhar province:</i> The 688 families, identified earlier by the joint assessment team in Dashti Qala, Rustaq and Taloqan, have received humanitarian assistance from WFP (food) and UNHCR (NFIs).</p>
<p>Gaps / Constraints:</p>	<p>In Kunduz, there are 8 assessment teams using the HEAT tool, but they are unable to complete the assessment process within a short period of time. Overall 4800 IDP families were reported in need in Kunduz Province and each assessment team is only able to visit approximately 40 families per day. The process needs reviewing to expedite assessments and timely response.</p>
