


Cameroon Refugees are predominantly from North-West and South-West Regions of Cameroon affected by the crisis between the government and activists calling for independence of the Anglophone Region. The arrival of Cameroonian refugees in Nigeria has since presented a new dimension to the already complex humanitarian situation in Nigeria.

OPERATIONAL FOOTPRINT AND IMPACT IN 2019



Over 19,122 refugees registered by UNHCR and the Government of Nigeria in 2019



Over 400 GBV incidents were registered in 2019 including physical assault, domestic violence, survival sex, rape/sexual assault, early marriage, teenage pregnancy, emotional abuse.



A total of 1,145 child protection cases were documented and addressed in 2019 including, physical abuse, child labour, neglect, defilement, sexual/emotional/verbal abuse, abduction, trafficking



20,000 refugees including 18,812 Cameroon refugees have health insurance



A total of 7,609 Cameroonian refugee children/youth out of 9,672 are enrolled in primary and secondary schools in Nigeria. This represents an enrolment rate of 70%




In 2019, 1,238 households were supported with shelter kits




A total of 425 gender-segregated households shared latrines and 203 bathing shelters were built in Adagom, Okende, and Ikyogen at an average of 25 persons/latrine drop hole


BREAKDOWN BY STATE




SETTLEMENT/HOST COMMUNITIES
