The coronavirus outbreak is taking a dire toll on displaced people throughout the Americas, with border closures and stay at home orders leading to lost livelihoods, evictions and a spike in stigmatization of refugees, asylum seekers and Internally Displaced Persons.

UNHCR's response builds on the Agency's experience managing emergencies and is implemented in coordination with the World Health Organization (WHO) and national authorities. The response prioritizes:

Situational highlights

Latin America has emerged as the current epicentre of the COVID-19 pandemic - with Brazil reporting the world's second-highest number of confirmed cases of the virus. The situation of refugees, asylum seekers, internally displaced populations, stateless people and others of concern to UNHCR remains critical. Governments have launched plans to reactivate the economy amid serious concerns about a long-term increase in poverty throughout the region

15,7 million people displaced in the Americas by the end of 2019

18% of all people of concern to UNHCR worldwide

Challenges faced by the population of concern

The pandemic exposes refugees and migrants to even greater hardships, as many have lost all sources of income and sometimes their homes amidst the lockdowns. This mean they are at greater risk of **destitution**, **exploitation**, **gender-based violence and abuse**.

Most refugees, IDPs and other populations of concern to UNHCR are now in need of urgent assistance to meet all their basic needs, including shelter, food and healthcare. Amid growing fear and social unrest, many refugees and migrants are unable to comply with hygiene and physical distancing measures, increasing the risk of stigmatization. This situation is even more dire for women, children, indigenous population and LGBTI communities.
