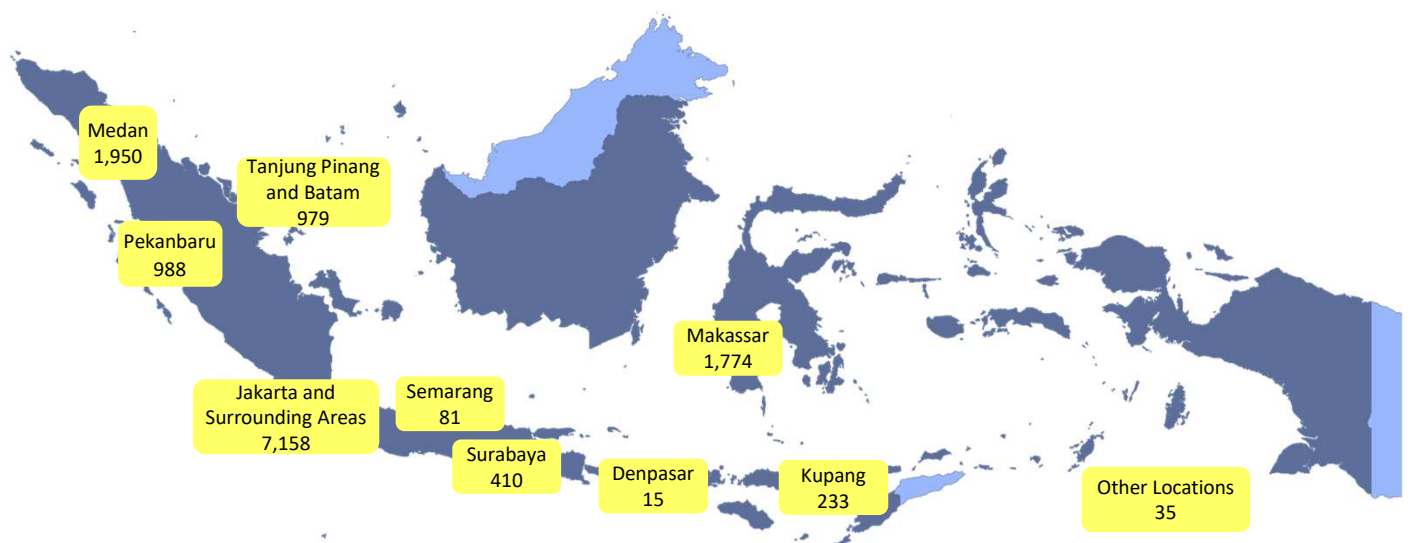

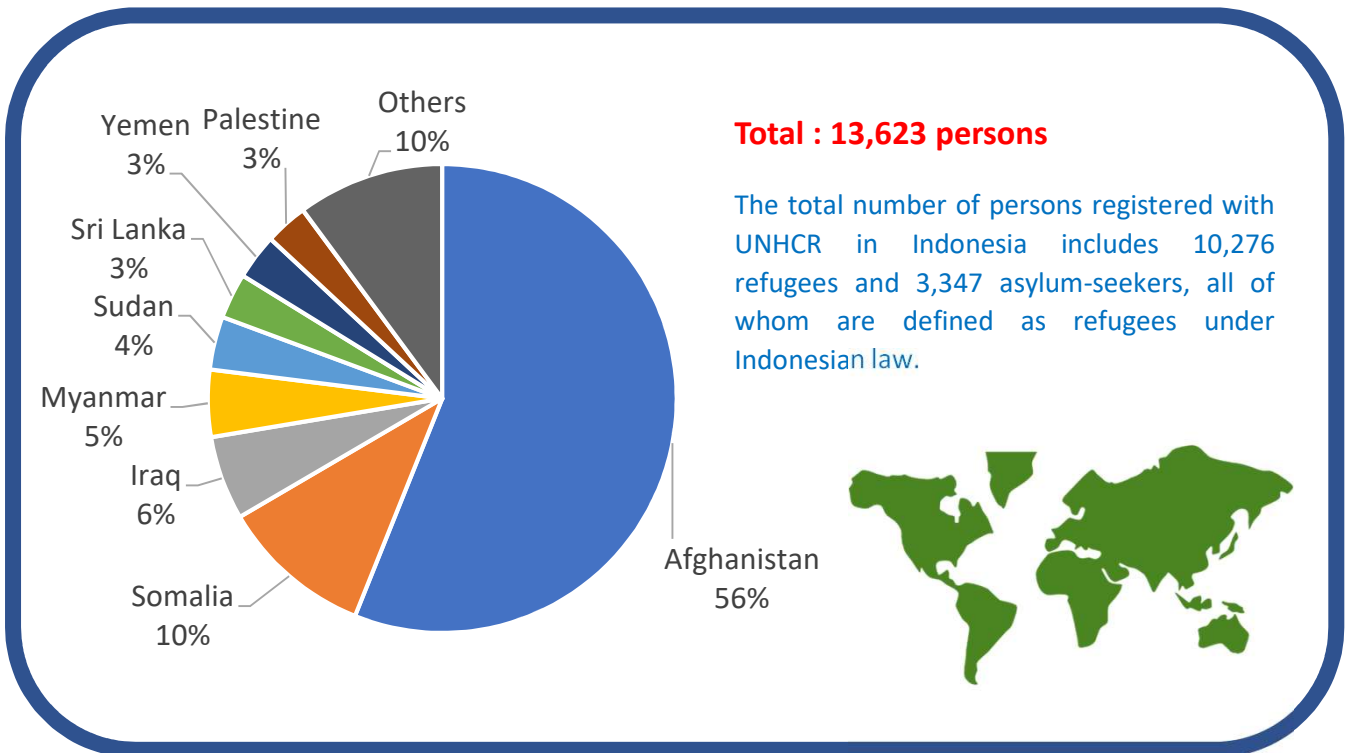

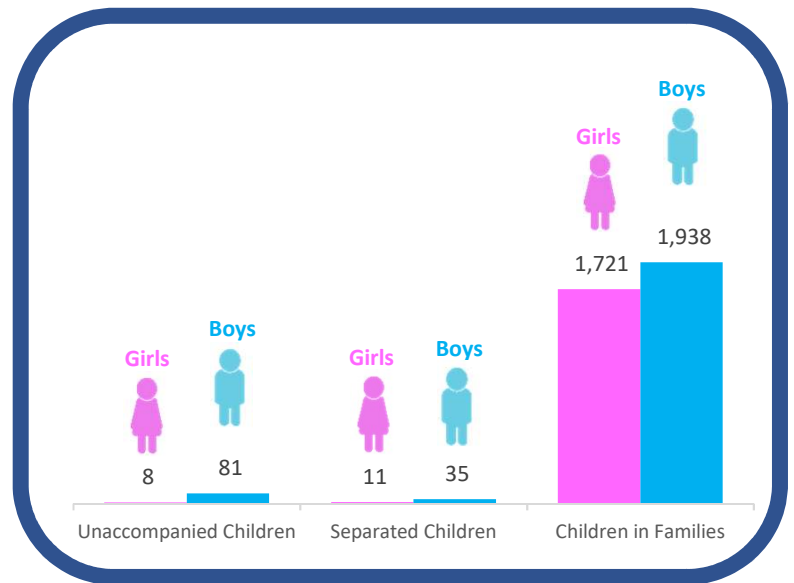

Children Registered with UNHCR

At the end of January some 3,794 children* were registered with UNHCR, including 3,659 children in families, 89 children who are unaccompanied by a parent or other adult relative, and 46 children who are separated from their parents but living with an adult caregiver.

Together with our partners, UNHCR is working to ensure all refugee children have access to an education, and as of January some 579 refugees were enrolled in accredited national schools.

Persons Registered with UNHCR in Detention and Alternatives to Detention

Some 10 persons registered with UNHCR, or less than 1 percent of the population were in immigration detention at the end of January, one of whom is a woman and none are children. UNHCR continues to advocate to end the detention of refugees in Indonesia and for those being detained to be released to alternative arrangements including placement in community accommodation, periodic reporting mechanisms, or community supervision. As of end-January, alternative accommodations were being provided for some 8,079 individuals (of whom 135 were unaccompanied or separated children).
