General update

CCCM partners continue to provide RCCE activities (awareness raising on COVID-19) at the IDP site-level targeting site leaders, committee groups and IDP populations. In total, CCCM partners have reached 921 IDP sites out of 2,344 IDP sites nationally, covering 1,091,009 persons (42% out of total 2.6 million). Partners have provided community members with tools such as megaphones to assist in enhancing the dissemination of COVID-19 awareness messages throughout their respective communities. Overall, 244 community members (80% female) were trained on COVID-19 prevention and response.

Site improvement activities in Hudur targeted 250 cash for worker laborers while site maintenance work in Kismayo employed 197 community members focusing on enhancing living conditions within IDP sites.

Partners conducted capacity building trainings for 459 IDP community members from Baidoa, Kahda and Daynile IDP sites, facilitating sessions on site planning and site management. Furthermore, as part of community sensitization efforts against evictions, CCCM partners trained 90 community members such as site leader on Housing, Land, and Property (HLP) topics such as security of land tenure and mitigating forced evictions.


In partnership with local authorities in Kismayo and Galkayo, CCCM partners conducted a site verification exercise in both districts verifying a total 144 sites and 30 sites respectively.

Eviction risk data collection by partners identified sites at-risk of evictions in Daynile, Kahda and Garowe. CCCM Partners were able to share data with HLP focal points and local authorities for further actions which resulted in formalized land tenure being granted for 331 IDPs households.

1866 complaints were recorded by CCCM partners during the month of September with a total of 84% complaints closed by partners during the month.

- Restricted humanitarian access in some parts of south and central Somalia
- Lack of information on service provision at site level
- Lack of land tenure and forced evictions inhibit the ability of partners to improve living conditions in sites
- Low levels of community participation and AAP inhibit ability to improve beneficiary targeting to include marginalized populations
- COVID-19 pandemic creating changes in service modalities and the need to prioritize risk communication activities over traditional CCCM tasks
